#### July 4<sup>th</sup>!! What Do You Actually Know?

We celebrate July 4<sup>th</sup> because it marks the birth of the United States of America. While we all know this fact, there are some other interesting fun facts that you may or may not know.

- The holiday does not celebrate the *signing* of the Declaration; it celebrates the *adoption* of the Declaration of Independence by the Second Continental Congress.
- Contrary to popular belief, only two Founding Fathers signed the Declaration of Independence on July 4, 1776 – John Hancock and Charles Thompson. The majority of signers penned their signatures on August 2, 1776.
- Independence Day became a Federal Holiday in 1870.
- The original <u>draft</u> of the Declaration of Independence was lost.
- The back of the Declaration of Independence that was signed says, "Original Declaration of Independence dated 4<sup>th</sup> July 1776."
- The average age of the Signers of the Declaration of Independence was 45. The youngest was Thomas Lynch, Jr (27) of South Carolina. The oldest delegate was Benjamin Franklin (70) of Pennsylvania. The lead author of The Declaration, Thomas Jefferson, was 33.
- After Jefferson wrote his first draft of the Declaration, the other members of the Declaration committee and the Continental Congress made 86 changes to Jefferson's draft, including shortening the overall length by more than a fourth.
- The only two signers of the Declaration of Independence who later served as President of the United States were John Adams and Thomas Jefferson.
- Every 4th of July the Liberty Bell in Philadelphia is tapped (not actually rung) thirteen times in honor of the original thirteen colonies.
- Our country now boasts 325 million citizens, but on the first Fourth of July there were only 2.5 million.
