

# CAHABA HEIGHTS PARK AND THE VESTAVIA HILLS AQUATIC COMPLEX OPEN FOR RESIDENTS!

#### Construction is complete on two major components of the Community Spaces Plan.

The Grand Opening and Ribbon Cutting for Cahaba Heights Park was held August 14, 2020 at 6pm, complete with a first pitch ceremony. Inclement weather held off just long enough for residents, City staff and elected officials to celebrate the official opening of the park. The park features four turfed ballfields, a new field house for concessions and restrooms, batting cages and an inclusive playground. Future development will result in a new New Merkel House and an adjacent dog park. We hope residents will take a day to visit and enjoy this new park, located at 4401 Dolly Ridge Road.

The Vestavia Hills Aquatic Complex opened Labor Day weekend, September 5-7, 2020. Over the course of opening weekend, hundreds of residents visited the complex to enjoy the leisure and competition pools. The opening, originally scheduled for Memorial Day weekend, was delayed due to a variety of issues, most notably the shortage of construction materials due to COVID-19 shutdowns coupled with excessive rain delays.

Typically, Labor Day weekend signifies the end of the swim season. But for Vestavia Hills, "Splish Splash September" was just the beginning! Residents were invited to enjoy the pool for FREE every weekend in September. As the weather gets colder, the complex will be closing for the year, but we will be counting the days to reopening Memorial Day week for the 2021 summer swim season!

Stay safe and I hope you enjoy your October!




We recently released the 2019-20 Annual Report for Vestavia Hills City Schools. Included are some of the many notable accomplishments of our

One of the most significant takeaways from the report is the spirit of philanthropy that thrives within our schools. Google defines *philanthropy* in part as "the desire to promote the welfare of others." It is often associated with financial contributions but can also include gifts of time, establishing meaningful relationships and meeting other basic human needs. Philanthropy in its most authentic form is putting the needs of others before our own without seeking notoriety or fame.

#### **NEW SANITATION PROVIDER**

Thank you to everyone who participated in the recent Vestavia Hills Listens sanitation survey. The City Council reviewed all comments and, in support of the overwhelming desire of residents, voted unanimously for the option that provides collection two times per week.

Beginning October 1, 2020, AmWaste will provide two weekly pickups per household. One pickup will be treated as waste only – everything collected that day will be taken to the landfill. The other pickup will be a "mixed stream" – everything collected that day will be taken to RePower South and sorted to separate recyclables from waste. While both pickups allow for the removal of waste, only one will be sorted to extract recyclables. Residents who wish to participate in the recycling process are encouraged to retain recyclables until the "mixed stream" pickup day each week. A letter detailing the collection schedule for your household will be mailed in advance of the October 1, 2020 start date.

Initially, existing carts will continue to be utilized for waste collection. As the supply of new carts is made available, AmWaste will collect

and replace existing Republic

Services carts.



Each household may receive up to 3 full-size trash carts at no charge. Additional carts may be purchased for a nominal fee. If your cart is broken and needs to be replaced immediately, please submit a request via the Action Center.

#### What Stays the Same?

- The option to recycle is <u>not</u> being eliminated.
- Bulk debris/waste pick-ups will remain as is. Service will
  continue to be requested via the Action Center and pickup
  will occur within 10 business days. Small debris (small limbs,
  bagged leaves and grass clippings, etc.) would continue to be
  collected with household trash in small amounts.
- Backdoor service will remain as is.


# CHAMBER NEWS Karen J. Odle, Vestavia Hills Chamber of Commerce President

A special thanks to all of the volunteers that worked at our 6th Annual Vestavia Hills Helping Hands in the Hills. Due to COVID-19, we had

to cut back on many of our household projects to protect our most vulnerable population. However, we still had over 100 volunteers, including those that worked on seven community projects that did not have close contact with the homeowners. We have had many notes and phone calls of appreciation from the recipients. This type of event is truly what makes Vestavia Hills "A Life Above."

In addition to the Helping Hands in the Hills projects, we continued Hazardous Waste Disposal, as well as Medication Take Back and the popular Shredding and e-Recycle event on September 12. Special thanks to the Vestavia Hills Police Department for handling the medication take back, where they collected 168 pounds of unneeded or expired medication. Republic Services did an outstanding job of helping us clean out unwanted paint/cans, pesticides, light bulbs (12 buckets) and batteries (18 buckets), collecting 12.68 tons of these items to dispose of properly. Protec eRecycling handled our electronic recycling and collected 14,935 pounds of electronic items. Last, but not least, Gone for Good, a United Ability company, helped shred and dispose of 11,090 pounds of paper that residents were able to recycle to keep out of the landfill.

We had record amounts of items collected and recycled and could certainly tell that residents have been cleaning out their homes this spring and summer. Thank you to every individual and business that worked so hard to make a difference in the lives of many. A special thank you to the following groups for their part in making this year's event a success: Montclair Neighbors; Philadelphia Baptist Church; Shades Mountain Baptist Church - English Sunday School Class; Vestavia Hills Chamber of Commerce Board of Directors; Sunrise Rotary; Vestavia Hills Rotary; and VHHS Baseball Team.



#### FIRE PREVENTION MONTH

Every October, the Vestavia Hills Fire Department recognizes Fire Prevention month. We take this opportunity to teach school-aged children about fire safety by discussing smoke alarms and portable heaters, as well as the prevention of all types of fires. Historically, VHFD would



take the smoke trailer to our schools so that students can practice exiting a smoke-filled structure. For the safety of students, teachers and fire department staff, we will not be visiting our schools this year. Instead, we will have a video for teachers to show that will emphasize a variety of safety precautions, such as exiting a smoke-filled structure, meeting up with your family after a fire and never re-entering a structure that is on fire. Be sure to take this opportunity to review your escape plan with the entire family so that everyone knows what to do in case of fire!

#### **HALLOWEEN SAFETY TIPS**

#### **Walk Safely**

- Cross the street at corners, using traffic signals and crosswalks. Look left, right and left again when crossing and keep looking as you cross.
- Put electronic devices down, keep heads up and walk, don't run, across the street.



- Teach children to make eye contact with drivers before crossing in front of them.
- Always walk on sidewalks or paths. If there are no sidewalks, walk facing traffic as far to the left as possible. Children should walk on direct routes with the fewest street crossings.
- Watch for cars that are turning or backing up. Teach children to never dart out into the street or cross between parked cars.
- Join kids under age 12 for trick-or-treating. If children are mature enough to be out without supervision, tell them to stick to familiar areas that are well lit and trick-or-treat in groups.

#### **Drive Safely**

- Slow down and be on alert, especially in residential neighborhoods. Children are excited on Halloween and may move in unpredictable ways.
- Take extra time to look for children at intersections, on medians and on curbs.
- Enter and exit driveways, alleys, etc. slowly and carefully.
- Get rid of any distractions in your car like your phone so you can concentrate on the road and your surroundings.
- Turn your headlights on earlier in the day to spot children from greater distances.
- Popular trick-or-treating hours are 5:30 to 9:30 p.m. Be especially alert during those hours.

#### **Costume Safety**

- Decorate costumes and bags with reflective tape or stickers and, if possible, choose light colors.
- Choose face paint and makeup whenever possible instead of masks, which can obstruct a child's vision.
- Carry glow sticks or flashlights to aid in being seen by drivers.
- When selecting a costume, make sure it is the right size to prevent trips and falls.

#### LIBRARY IN THE FOREST

The Library Board of Trustees met recently and, following extensive discussions regarding the opening of the library, have elected to remain closed. Opening the library will be reevaluated at the next regular BOT meeting scheduled for October 28, 2020. In the meantime, patrons are encouraged to take advantage of online programming and databases, and pick-up of materials via curbside service. A new service launched last month – Li(VE)brarians – where patrons can utilize Skype to interact live with library staff to receive one-on-one reference, reader's advisory assistance and technology instruction. Also new in September –

#### Why is the Library Still Closed?

- 1. Minor renovations. Beginning October 1, 2020, the library is scheduled to undergo minor renovations, including carpet replacement, which will require the removal of furniture and bookshelves.
- 2. Staffing concerns. Compared to other local libraries, the Library in the Forest has a relatively small staff (32 employees) but have had three COVID-19 cases in the last two months. If directly exposed, multiple staff members would be required to self-quarantine for a minimum of 14 days and the library would not have sufficient staff to cover open departments.
- 3. After school library use. A significant number of students typically use the library on a daily basis, especially on weekday afternoons.

  Due to capacity limitations, the library would not be able to accommodate the students that previously spent their afternoons at the library.
- **4. Case numbers.** For the safety of the library staff and patrons, the BOT is continuing to monitor the number of COVID-19 cases in Jefferson County and will consider reopening only after a steady decline in cases over a 14-day period.


