VESTAVIA HILLS FIRE DEPARTMENT EARNS CLASS 1 ISO RATING

The Vestavia Hills Fire Department has earned a Class 1 Public Protection Classification (PPC) rating by Insurance Services Office (ISO) and received the official designation on February 7, 2022 at The Wynfrey Hotel in Hoover, Ala. Nearly 40,000 fire departments were evaluated, and VHFD is one of the only 388 departments to receive a Class 1 rating this year. This places VHFD in the top 1% of all fire departments nationwide. A Class 1 rating is the best rating that can be achieved and represents exemplary fire protection. VHFD is proud to be in this select group.

ISO is an organization that independently measures and evaluates the ability of fire departments nationwide to respond to and suppress structure fires. Upon completion of their assessment, ISO assigns a PPC code ranging from 1 to 10, with Class 1 representing exemplary fire protection, and Class 10 indicating that the fire-suppression program does not meet ISO's minimum criteria. Insurance companies utilize ISO information, along with other factors, to establish local commercial and residential property coverage rates – generally offering lower premiums in communities with a high ISO rating.

ISO grades are earned in four major areas:

- Fire Department ability to respond to structure fires (with adequate staffing), appropriately equipped apparatus, training and annual pre-fire planning inspections
- Water System hydrant locations, pressures and inspections
- Emergency Communications internal and external communications processes and procedures
- Community Risk Reduction fire prevention and fire safety education in the community

The improvement in the rating reflects the commitment from our City administration, and the dedication and hard work of all Vestavia Hills Fire Department personnel. The department would also like to thank the Birmingham Water Works and Shelby 911 for their assistance in achieving this high ranking.

Congratulations to Chief Green and all of our Vestavia Hills Fire Department personnel.

MAYOR'S MESSAGE

Welcome to March! It is the time of year to say goodbye to winter and hello to spring. However, this may not be the case this year. On February 2, the noted groundhog meteorologist, Punxsutawney Phil, emerged from his burrow and promptly saw his shadow. According to legend, if he sees his shadow, we are in for six more weeks of winter.

Regardless of the weather, construction of the new Vestavia Hills Civic Center continues. We are optimistic that it will be completed by early summer. As I mentioned in a previous article, this will be one the most exciting additions to our parks and recreation facilities. You will be impressed with this facility. We are told by the Birmingham Convention and Visitors Bureau that our 10,000 square foot ballroom will be the third largest banquet facility in the Birmingham metropolitan area. Located on the second floor of the building, it offers a panoramic view of the Highway 280 valley and Double Oak Mountain to the southeast of our city.

In the meantime, phase three of the Wald Park improvements is underway and will be completed soon. You can follow these improvements on the City's website.

There are a couple of achievements to mention:

First, the Vestavia Hills Fire Department has received an Insurance Services Office (ISO) Class 1 rating. ISO is an organization that independently measures and evaluates the ability of fire departments nationwide to respond to and suppress structure fires. Upon completion of their assessment, ISO assigns a Public Protection Classification code ranging from 1 to 10, with Class 1 representing exemplary fire protection, and Class 10 indicating that the fire-suppression program does not meet ISO's minimum criteria. Insurance companies utilize ISO information, along with other factors, to establish local commercial and residential property coverage rates - generally offering lower premiums in communities with a high ISO rating. This is a significant accomplishment by Fire Chief Marvin Green and his staff. Of the nearly 40,000 fire departments nationwide, VHFD is one of the only 388 departments that received a Class 1 rating, placing VHFD in the top 1% for fire departments. This is the highest rating you can receive. Thank you to Chief Green and his department for this accomplishment.

Secondly, Sandi Wilson of our Parks and Recreation Department, received the Jim Spain Professional of the Year award at the recent Alabama Recreation and Parks Association conference. This award honors individuals who have rendered outstanding service or accomplishments to the leisure service, recreation, parks and/ or conservation professions through leadership and/or active involvement. This is the highest award given by the state association. City Manager Jeff Downes moderated two town hall meetings last month to discuss The Bray – a large, mixed-use city center concept proposed for the 800 acres yet to be developed by the Liberty Park Joint Venture, LLP. The goal of the meetings was to provide information and allow stakeholders to ask questions about the proposed development. There will be more to come as the Council reviews what the Liberty Park Joint Venture describes as the "ultimate live, work and play lifestyle – all in Liberty Park."

Don't forget to "spring forward" when daylight saving time begins on March 13!

SUPERINTENDENT'S MESSAGE

Everything learned in school is not exclusively from a textbook. In fact, character traits like perseverance, respecting others and empathy are honed when students are in school interacting in classrooms, hallways, concert venues or athletic fields. The Vestavia Hills City

Schools strategic plan goals prioritize learning at a profound level while supporting the growth of students' social and emotional skills. I would like to highlight one shining example of how these priorities are intertwined in programs throughout our system.

This year, kindergarten through fifth grade students at Vestavia Hills Elementary Liberty Park have been experiencing learning in a science, technology, engineering and math (STEM) lab. They attend the class once a week throughout the year and participate in hands-on STEM learning activities. The system is piloting the class at VHELP with a vision of eventually expanding it to every elementary school in our system. The class weaves academic rigor and character education into an engaging and dynamic class.

Principal, Dr. Blair Inabinet, describes it this way: "STEM is a safe place to foster growth mindsets in our children, wherein they utilize higher-order thinking skills to solve relevant, real-world problems and collaborate with peers in inquiry-based learning." STEM Lab teacher Martha Martin adds that "students in the STEM class ask questions, explore ideas, model solutions, evaluate outcomes and explain everything learned in the process."

Mrs. Martin threads the school's "R.E.B.E.L.S." core values into her lessons. She explains, "While most STEM programs focus solely on engineering skills, I believe it is vital that we model and practice the life skills that will empower our children to thrive no matter what career path they choose. I want our students to see the connections between engineering skills and life skills, between solving problems in the classroom and solving problems in the world.

"We show ourselves and others **R**espect as we share ideas. We will listen with **E**mpathy to the needs of others so that we can help solve their problems. We will fail, but we will face our failures with **B**ravery and focus on how those failures lead to our success. We will strive for **E**xcellence in all that we do and say. We will create solutions that leave a **L**egacy for those who follow in our footsteps. We will look for creative ways to **S**erve others and make a difference."

WHO DESIGNED VESTAVIA HILLS?

Historical documents archived in the Library of Congress indicate that Vestavia Hills was designed by Olmsted Brothers, the amazing landscape architecture firm established in 1898 by brothers John Charles Olmsted and Frederick Law Olmsted Jr., sons of landscape architect, Frederick Law Olmsted. Their firm designed major cities and projects nationwide, including Central Park, Washington D.C. and Biltmore Estate.
