As I have mentioned previously, April is the month that we officially recognize the important role that volunteers play in our city. April became "National Volunteer Month" as part of President George H. W. Bush's "1000 Points of Light" campaign in 1991. I cannot emphasize enough the difference that volunteers make in our city. We are blessed to have so many citizens that volunteer their time and talents to so many different causes. Finally, I would like to commend the Cahaba River Society in their efforts to restore and protect the Cahaba River watershed. Founded in 1988, they have continuously offered programs to raise awareness about the rich diversity of life in and around the river. WHO DESIGNED VESTAVIA HILLS?

Historical documents archived in the Library of Congress indicate that Vestavia Hills was designed by Olmsted Brothers, the amazing landscape architecture firm established in 1898 by brothers John Charles Olmsted and Frederick Law Olmsted Jr., sons of landscape architect, Frederick Law Olmsted. Their firm designed major cities and projects nationwide, including Central Park, Washington D.C. and Biltmore Estate.

SUPERINTENDENT'S MESSAGE

One goal of the Vestavia Hills City Schools strategic plan is a clarion call to "embrace our leadership role in developing common understandings and shared community support for confronting the problems and challenges that impact the system, youth and families." This ambitious goal is achievable because of the exceptional professionals

in our schools who are entrusted with educating our children. There are no programs or curriculum that take the place of caring educators who have a heart for wanting children to succeed.

Counselors have long been at the forefront of partnering with students and families in confronting challenges to learning. Because of the unparalleled support of our community, VHCS has 21 counselors who serve more than 7,000 students. Mrs. Cortney McKinney serves as the counselor at Vestavia Hills Elementary Cahaba Heights and was recently named our Elementary Teacher of the Year. She describes the calling of counselors as one of assisting students in removing the factors that create limits to learning and that "can alter the trajectory of student success."

Mrs. McKinney's program exemplifies what we do in each of our schools to promote a safe and nurturing learning environment. It starts with equipping teachers with the necessary knowledge and skills to recognize challenges our students face. She is also relentless in collaborating with community partners in ways that effectively confront those challenges.

Mrs. McKinney explains her primary role as being a helper to students. She spends most of her time investing in the lives of students by teaching about core values, engaging in exploring career interests and setting individual goals. Her focus is on building authentic, trusting relationships with each one of them. Earlier this year, I had the privilege of joining her for a class and experienced the value of this work. Students were literally on the edge of their seats with the lesson they learned about the school's core values.

The great news is that no matter which school our children attend, they are supported by counselors with the same enthusiasm and commitment as Mrs. McKinney.
