#### **CITY MANAGER'S REPORT**

In 2002, the Knight Foundation, in collaboration with the Gallup organization, conducted a survey known as the "Soul of the Community Survey." One of the survey goals was to objectively determine why people live where they live and the ramifications of those decisions. They made several observations after reviewing the data:

- Most "attached" communities have higher GDP growth
- When cities make themselves easier to connect with emotionally, they invite the human heart to become a driver of community, economic and social development
- However, it is rare to find that special love

So, if "attached" communities receive the greatest public dividends and it is hard to find a large number of such communities, what can be learned from communities that have greater emotional connection? It was concluded that the greatest drivers for these communities were a sense of openness, greater social offerings and superior aesthetics. This is not surprising when considering our own personal relationships. A good relationship often starts out with a recognition of the other's beauty, followed by a courtship where shared social activities are frequent, and there is an ultimate acceptance of the other regardless of human differences. The end result is "love." Following suit, the "attachment and love" for a community is not driven by functional factors but are enhanced by the aforementioned openness, social offerings and aesthetics. A high achieving city will strive to provide all three of these drivers IN ADDITION TO the basic functional building blocks of the city experience.

If you subscribe to this theory as I do, the question for me, as City Manager, then becomes how does the City partner with community stakeholders to make headway in creating this emotional connection. While not perfect in any way, the collective Vestavia Hills community has made frequent, solid movement in this direction in the recent months. As such, I would like to highlight several very notable actions that I shared when I spoke at last month's Chamber of Commerce luncheon.

Private leadership, from the eastern to the western end of the City, has committed to creating opportunity for social offerings that foster the emotional connection. This can be seen at the Vestavia City Center where a newly created gathering area serves as a magnet for our residents to share time together. This can be seen in the recently approved "Great Lawn" that is planned for The Bray development in Liberty Park. Last but not least, the frequent Cahaba Heights merchant-led celebrations are becoming a monthly expectation. From the public perspective, the addition of public parks and green space at Wald Park, along with the planned enhancements at Altadena Valley Park, have become the envy of many communities. View these actions as metaphorical love notes to those that engage with our city. They are just a few examples of the means to creating a love affair with your city. My commitment is to find many different ways to act on this both directly and indirectly. I hope you, our resident, can also find ways to further the emotional connectivity with your city. It can start as simply as sharing a wonderful Vestavia Hills experience with someone that might not be aware of what we have to offer. I hope the concept of connecting with your city speaks to you in a powerful way. And I hope you enjoy your spring and summer in Vestavia Hills!

## SUPERINTENDENT'S MESSAGE

School Days, school days, dear old Golden Rule days Readin' and 'ritin' and 'rithmetic...

Much about what students learn and do in school has changed since those lyrics were penned more than a century ago. And while the foundation of education is still letters, words and numbers, our students are more

engaged than ever in experiences that make literacy and numeracy come to life. Envision a chair seat as the product of learning supported by legs that include academics, arts, extracurricular activities and athletics. Each of the legs plays an important role in establishing a sturdy foundation of knowledge and skills.

Throughout the school year, the Board of Education receives reports from various programs that support our mission. In our April meeting, we featured the arts. VHHS dance instructor, Mrs. Faith Lenhart, says, "An arts education is vital to the education of the whole child. Arts classes offer students the opportunity to individually and collaboratively problem-solve to create original works of art. The arts provide alternative opportunities to reward students who learn differently. The time management and social skills that students learn in a visual or performing arts class will serve them throughout life."

VHCS believes and invests in the importance of the fine arts. Because of the unparalleled support of our community, we employ 30 arts teachers across the system to provide these wonderful experiences for students. All students in grades K-5 take music and art classes. Middle school students can experience learning through art, band and choir classes. When they become freshmen, dance and theatre are added to their options. More than half of students in grades 6-12 participate in an arts program or class. In the Class of 2022, 102 seniors earned the Arts Achievement Seal.

This year, the tradition of excellence in the arts continues. VHHS students have been named as state champions in theatre competitions; choral and band programs have received superior ratings in competitions; and our JV and Varsity Rebelettes were state champions and placed first and second, respectively, in national competition. Finally, the multiple performances from our students in grades K-12 this year have been wonderfully impressive.

Our arts staff continues to challenge the process of what we are doing to find ways to make it better. Take an opportunity to listen to *The Intentional Pursuit* podcast on our website to learn more about what they are doing. We have designed great ideas for the future that can elevate our program to a new pinnacle of success. I look forward to sharing more about this vision with you in the fall.




