CITY MANAGER'S REPORT

Oftentimes, veteran public servants such as myself see great value in tangible accomplishments associated with our jobs. Whether it is the planning and construction of a road or building, the completion of an idea hatched in the public forum that brings value to our residents is what we are here to facilitate. However, I am writing today with a smile on my face – not for an object that has been raised from nothing, but I am smiling thinking about the lives that are being changed by the actions of our community leaders and City staff that are bringing our

community's "brick and mortar" to life.

The most direct example that I want to highlight is our Miracle League Program. Initiated by community volunteers and supported by new City assets, the most vulnerable, special individuals in our city now have a place to call home and have fun taking part in the national pastime –

baseball. What has led to this poignant experience, for me, was my participation as a coach for the Miracle League Challenge Team. This team was created to advance the skill level of our special needs program participants through more frequent practice and exploration of a competitive environment by taking Miracle League teams from other communities. This season the Vestavia Hills "Red Tornadoes," as they call themselves, have played Helena, Moody and the Exceptional Foundation, each in a two-game series.



The number of home runs, hits and strikeouts do not matter. The number of smiles created is the only statistic that does matter. As a coach, it was the greatest blessing to see the enthusiasm and sense of pride that each of the participants showed day in and day out.

I was told that young Fitts Sanders awakened every practice and game day with baseball on his mind and was devastated if it rained. Chad Littleton laid out his uniform days in advance of a game. Matthew Fisher and his dad would sprint to the ball field to get in all the extra practice time they could find. Wilson Taylor's parents shuffled carpool drivers to make sure their son could hit a home run against the week's competition, while Tripp Wiggins and Lyndsay Davis were cemented in their positions at first and third base and would not let anyone replace them on the diamond. These were individuals who might be on the outside looking in if it were not for the Miracle League. There are many examples of players whose lives were enriched by this season's program. The thing to remember is that without the support of programs such as the Miracle League, a whole segment of our population would be missing a major component of their life experience. My thought is that everyone wants a shot at participating in life not just observing.

Whether it is a special needs population or an able-bodied population, the ability to enhance the quality of life through time and effort is just as important as building things. Our wonderful community has been blessed with the tangible items, so let's now work to provide spirit, ideas and elbow grease so that our community can be all it can be. Keep this in mind when you are looking for a way to make a difference in Vestavia Hills.

There are still a few Infrastructure and Community Spaces Plan (CSP) projects that are nearing completion and should be finished this summer. The infrastructure component of the plan includes the road

improvements on Crosshaven Drive in Cahaba Heights. Anyone who travels in that area frequently knows this has been in the works for a while. Many unforeseen infrastructure issues were discovered during construction and had to be rectified, but two of the three construction phases are complete, and the finish line is in sight.

The improvements are continuing at Wald Park. Phase three includes the construction of tennis courts, pickleball courts, additional parking and a dog park adjacent to the upper end of the tennis courts. With this additional dog park, the City will have three designated dog parks located at Wald Park, Cahaba Heights Park and SHAC.

We anticipate the much-awaited completion of our Civic Center this summer. Dealing with supply chain issues for construction materials has been tedious, but the project is coming along. Plans for a grand opening celebration will be announced as we near completion. We hope you will join us to celebrate the opening of this amazing community amenity.


