## CITY MANAGER'S REPORT

I hope everyone had a great summer and is getting settled in for a good school year, football season and cooler temperatures. As our students are working at self-improvement, we in city government continue our efforts at improving our skills to provide more efficient and user-friendly services. Some people may consider efficiency and local government operations an oxymoron. I am not such a cynic. While governmental systems are designed to protect against unintentionally harming or alienating individuals, thereby creating "red tape" in the process, there

are ways local government can streamline access to municipal services. I am proud to share with you the latest City efforts in this arena.















First, most Vestavia Hills residents are aware of our Action Center. The Action Center is the one stop shop to request services from the City of Vestavia Hills. We have had this online service available since 2014, and it can be found on our homepage at vhal.org or through the dedicated app for your mobile device. If you

need a pothole filled, debris picked up from your home or to report speeding in your neighborhood, you are just a few clicks away from getting the request to the most appropriate party in City government. Your request can then be managed for responsiveness, and we can evaluate problem areas within our city.



While the Action Center is a helpful, routine means of communicating with the City, we still have certain City services that require an application and permitting approval prior to commencement of activities. In the past, many of these activities required trips to City Hall, frustration over what

informational items are required and ultimately confusion on the status of the requested permit or other City approval. Given our desires to improve this area of citizen engagement, we have introduced a comprehensive option for online services that can be accessed from our homepage as well. These services allow a complete virtual option when a resident or their contractor needs various building permits or other business transactions with the City. With this introduction, our goal is to not only make conducting business easier, but to also monitor and manage how quickly and efficiently we respond to requests. Additionally, the online services options allow registered users the ability to monitor the progress of their request. The key here is improved transparency of City efforts and proper management of online services.



In addition to the Action Center and online services portal, we have launched a transparency portal. It is also accessible from the homepage of the City website. Any interested resident may visit this portal to peruse many different facets of Vestavia Hills' government. Whether it is a review of budget variances,

### **MAYOR'S MESSAGE**

I hope everyone had an enjoyable summer. It is hard to believe that it has passed so quickly and that our students have started a new school year.

The 2022 World Games concluded in July, and what an experience that was for Birmingham and surrounding areas. The economic impact, though not presently

determined, should be huge. There were many memorable moments, especially the standing ovation for the Ukrainian team as they entered Protective Stadium during the Opening Ceremony. I was thrilled to see The World Games 2022 Committee present a check for \$54,000 to support athletes and sports in Ukraine.

On a personal note, I particularly enjoyed participating in the "Old Glory Relay" sponsored by the Team Red, White and Blue (RWB). Team RWB carried a U.S. flag that had flown over the U.S. Capitol through 15 states and over 3100 miles and presented that flag at the opening ceremony of the World Games in Birmingham. A portion of the route to Birmingham passed through Vestavia Hills, and it was an honor for me to carry the flag from City Hall to Highway 31 and hand it off to my son, Stuart Curry. Stuart is an Air Force veteran and he, along with Air Force veteran Greg Cook, carried the flag to the next relay point in Vestavia Hills.

On August 23, the City hosted another "Crimes Against the Elderly" seminar at Vestavia Hills Methodist Church. This year's program addressed two major topics – financial scams and elder abuse. Vestavia Hills Police Department personnel, along with representatives from the Federal Bureau of Investigation, addressed some of the more common financial scams. Representatives from other participating agencies also information about elder abuse. I find it hard to grasp that this is happening in today's society, and it is particularly troublesome that family members and caregivers are the primary offenders. We, as individuals and as a city, owe it to our seniors to protect this "Greatest Generation." Thanks to all the agencies that assisted with this program.

One of the most frequently shared citizen complaints is speeding in our neighborhoods. These calls are in neighborhoods throughout the City and are not isolated to any particular area which makes it burdensome for our Police Department to handle. To address this issue, we have established a "traffic-calming" process that citizens can use to initiate the City's response. After receiving the request, City staff can place speed detection devices in neighborhoods in an attempt to make drivers aware of excessive speeds. In addition, VHPD patrol units can monitor speeding and issue citations when warranted. I am told that the purpose of traffic citations is to modify driver behavior thereby reducing accidents, including the prevention of possible fatalities.

This is all about civility. Civility, which comes to us from the Latin word for citizen, includes not only the notions of courtesy and politeness, but also such matters as social relationships and proper conduct in human relationships. Civility is the essential glue that holds society together, and it involves such important issues as friendship, altruism, responsibility, dignity and justice.

Courteous and responsible driving habits are one of the elements of civility. Simply put, you would not want drivers speeding down YOUR street. Let's be responsible citizens, lower our driving speeds and reduce the number of speeding complaints.

As you have most likely heard by now, the City acquired the former Days Inn property on Highway 31. I am excited about the acquisition as this will become the catalyst for renovation of the southern-most entrance to Vestavia Hills. Developers have already shared ideas for new restaurants and other retail businesses and this property would certainly be available to further that development. I look forward to the project enhancing this portion of Vestavia Hills and providing an economic boost for this area.

Our more than 7,000 students will be busy making connections to new knowledge and friends while problem-solving, exploring and creating. I am truly amazed at how many opportunities our students will have because of the unparalleled support of the Vestavia

Hills community. Whether you are an employee, parent, grandparent or community member, there is much to be celebrated in our school system. And one of our priorities is to communicate all of the wonderful things that happen when our students come to school.

Each August, we publish an Annual Report that summarizes the accomplishments of our students from the past year. You can read that report by visiting our website at www.vhcs.us/reports. The website is a helpful resource for information about our school system strategic plan, calendars, policies, employment opportunities and budgets. You can also learn about content standards for the courses we teach and the many resources available to students and families. Each school has its own website with school-specific information about academics, extracurricular activities and a staff directory. These pages are viewed more than 1.5 million times per year, making the VHCS website one of our most important resources for community engagement.

There are many other ways to keep up with what is happening in our school system in real-time. Each of our schools use social media such as Facebook, Instagram and Twitter, as well as e-newsletters to share events, announcements and good news about student achievements and accolades. We provide our families and students with mobile apps to keep track of calendar updates, lunch menus and scores from athletic events. We also use a mass notification system that can alert parents instantly through phone calls, text messages and emails to changes in school schedules and other important messages.

The school system provides a number of other opportunities to stay connected. All of our Board of Education meetings are live-streamed on YouTube, and meeting agendas and minutes are posted on our website. Our VHCS podcast gives the community an opportunity to hear from school staff and students about the great work taking place in the schools. And, we have enjoyed a longstanding partnership with the City and Chamber of Commerce on the production of this community newsletter to help share our story with every Vestavia Hills resident.

Nobel laureate George Bernard Shaw once wrote, "The single biggest problem in communication is the illusion that it has taken place."

We believe our work as a school system to communicate, inform and

engage is never finished because we know that the education of our children is a partnership with families and the community. #### **GET TO KNOW PUBLIC WORKS**

What is the function of Public Works in Vestavia Hills? Public works is the combination of physical assets, management practices, policies and personnel necessary for a municipality to provide and sustain structures and services essential to the welfare and acceptable quality of life for its residents. When disaster strikes, immediate action by First Responders can make a life-or-death difference. In the midst of a crisis, residents expect to see uniformed service providers – fire, police and medical services. However, another essential member of the team is Public Works, whose chief responsibilities include designing, building, operating, maintaining and protecting our public infrastructure and facilities. When the infrastructure is threatened, Public Works is prepared to take a comprehensive and collaborative role with other First Responders in emergency management – prepared and equipped to safeguard lives and reduce or repair damaged critical infrastructure.

In addition to the role of First Responder, Vestavia Hills Public Works staff oversees the sanitation contract and manages litter collection, stormwater infrastructure and inspection, right of way maintenance (both public and private) and other issues related to the public rights of way. If you have a need for Public Works' services, we encourage you to submit your request in the Vestavia Hills Action Center via the app or online at www.vhal.org/action-center, as this is the best way for our staff to track and manage your concerns. Be on the lookout for future articles highlighting various areas of operation and updates on ongoing projects!


