

SUPERINTENDENT'S MESSAGE

From August to May, children spend about a third of the normal work week on a school campus. My expectation, like any parent, is that the school buildings they attend be safe and nurturing places — a home away from home. In Vestavia Hills City Schools, maintaining just such a place is a pillar of our mission to provide every student the opportunity to learn without limits. And it

is also a priority in the vision of our 1Rebel 1Future plan.

Maintaining a healthy indoor environment is paramount when considering safety inside school buildings. Heating, ventilation and air conditioning (HVAC) systems that properly circulate and ventilate are critical to indoor air quality. It's a reasonable expectation that students and staff be cool when it's hot outside and warm when it's cold. These are essential characteristics of a comfortable environment where students can fully focus on their learning.

VHCS has more than 770 HVAC units on 9 campuses. Our maintenance team strives to make sure each unit operates effectively despite its age or condition. That can be a challenge when considering that 38% of our HVAC systems are more than 15 years old, and many are approaching 30 years of age. As part of the 1Rebel 1Future plan,

we will replace those aging systems with modern, high-efficiency units that promote healthier classroom environments.

Good lighting is another important component of a nurturing space for learning. VHCS maintains over 17,000 light fixtures. Two-thirds of those are older fixtures that do not provide optimal classroom lighting. Currently, Vestavia Hills High School and Louis Pizitz Middle School are the only campuses complete with modern LED light fixtures that provide the best visibility for children and teachers. The 1Rebel 1Future vision will add this LED lighting in all of our schools.

This year, we expect to spend approximately \$3.2 million in utility costs — electricity, gas and water. VHCS has partnered with Schneider Electric to develop a comprehensive energy management plan that includes upgrades of HVAC systems, lighting and various roof replacements. These upgrades will be part of the 1Rebel 1Future plan and will reduce our utility costs by an estimated \$1 million per year. That savings could be reinvested in our strategic plan goals: providing profound learning experiences for our children and supporting them through their academic and life challenges.

DON'T INVITE VHFD TO DINNER!

With the holidays fast approaching, attention will soon turn to families and food. How many people are coming for dinner? How many sweet potatoes do I need? How many gallons of gravy will Uncle Marvin put on his turkey? And most importantly ... How can I safely fry my turkey and enjoy a "fire free" Thanksgiving holiday?


- · Follow the manufacturer's guidelines for your fryer
- Make sure the fryer is level and in an open area away from all structures, trees and shrubbery.
- Keep the fryer off of wooden decks and out of garages.
- Make sure the turkey is thawed out and completely dry.
 Mixing water and hot oil will make for a bad day and possibly a trip to the hospital.
- Wear protective gear (goggles, gloves and apron) in case the oil splatters.
- Don't overfill the pot with oil.
- Don't leave the turkey unattended while cooking.
- Keep an ABC extinguisher close by in case of a fire.
 Never try to extinguish an oil fire with water.

Other safety tips while cooking this holiday season:

- Always stay in the kitchen when frying, broiling, grilling or boiling food. If you leave the kitchen for any reason, turn the stove off.
- When simmering, baking or roasting food, use a timer as a reminder to check the food regularly.
- Keep all flammable materials away from your stove.
 This includes oven mitts, towels, food packaging, etc.
- Do not cook when sleepy. Many kitchen fires start when people start cooking and then fall asleep (while planning to "rest for a few minutes").

If you do have a small fire on a stove, cover the pan with a lid and turn off the burner. **DO NOT put water on a grease fire.** This will spread the fire and possibly injure you. If you have a small fire in the oven, turn the oven off and leave the door closed. If all else fails, get out of the house, close the door behind you and call 911 from outside! We would rather you call us and not need us, than not call and do need us. Have a Happy Thanksgiving!


