MAYOR'S MESSAGE

The 32nd annual Dogwood Prayer Breakfast was held on April 18. Lindy Cleveland, the Director of Unless U, described the services that they provide to adults with developmental disabilities and their families. What a blessing it is that Unless U can provide these students with continuing education and life skills in an environment that promotes independence. We are proud to have them in Vestavia Hills.

April 16-22 is "National Volunteer Recognition Week." This event is nationally recognized and celebrated by cities everywhere. One of the first things that I learned upon becoming Mayor was the significant contribution that volunteers make for our city. There are many boards that utilize volunteers to conduct City business – Planning and Zoning, Board of Zoning Adjustment, Library Board of Trustees, Parks and Recreation Board, Beautification Board, Sibyl Temple Foundation, plus a few different garden clubs. There are also volunteer boards that specifically support the school system – Board of Education and Vestavia Hills City Schools Foundation, plus numerous PTO volunteers. Needless to say, the City would not be able to achieve all that we do without the volunteers that serve on these boards. Thank you to all who are serving or have previously served in these volunteer efforts.

May is an inspirational month because that is when we celebrate Memorial Day and pay tribute to all the military veterans that died serving our nation. The U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs estimates that over one million veterans died in combat from the time our nation was founded until our present day "War on Terror." Memorial Day is not to be confused with Veterans Day wherein we celebrate all veterans, living and deceased, and thank them for their service to our nation. We should never forget the ultimate sacrifice that our service men and women have made preserving our way of life.

Finally, join me in paying tribute to our peace officers. In 1962, President Kennedy proclaimed May 15 as National Peace Officers Memorial Day and the calendar week in which May 15 falls is delegated as "National Police Week." During this week we pay tribute to those law enforcement officers who lost their lives in the line of duty for the safety and protection of others.

We are truly blessed to live in one of the safest cities in the United States, as well as in Alabama. For the fourth time in a row, our city has been designated as the safest city in Alabama for cities with populations over 30,000 citizens. Don't forget that Mother's Day is May 14. I remember the 1970's commercial that legendary Coach Bryant did for Southern Bell telephone company. He said "One of the first things we tell our players is to keep in touch with their families. And when our freshmen first arrive, we ask them to write a postcard home, right then. You know, we keep them pretty busy, but they always have time to pick up the phone and call. And it's really important to keep in touch."

He closed the commercial by saying, "Have you called your mama today? I sure wish I could call mine." How many of you join me in saying I wish I could call my mother today?

Last, but not least, May is when we celebrate the graduation of our Vestavia Hills High School senior class. This year's class features 21 National Merit Semi-finalists and 20 National Merit Finalists, which is the highest number in the state. The \$44 million in scholarship offers is a school record. I always look forward to the opportunity to address the graduating seniors and challenge them to pursue their dreams while remembering to serve others along the way. This year's graduation ceremony will be held on May 23.

SUPERINTENDENT'S MESSAGE

Over the past 53 years, our Vestavia Hills school system has distinguished itself as one of the best. This is directly attributable to the unparalleled support it has received from our community.

Since its inception, the citizens of Vestavia Hills have been called upon three times to approve property tax increases to meet the needs of the schools. Each time, our

community has answered the call.

Much has changed since our last property tax election in May 1990. In a brief span of time, between 2011–2015, our schools grew from 6,000 students to more than 7,000. To meet the needs of this dramatic increase, we added two campuses, new classroom additions, and larger cafeterias, gymnasiums and libraries. We also increased the number of teachers and support staff in order to maintain low class sizes, meet the increasingly complex needs of our students and continue offering unique academic opportunities. These needed investments have placed financial limits on our ability to carry out our mission.

Vestavia Hills City Schools has a plan to protect the legacy of excellence our community has come to expect. We will protect student experiences by strengthening academic opportunities, by adding new world language and STEM classes for all elementary students. We will provide a greater level of support for teachers and students. We will protect school experiences by renewing, repairing and revitalizing our decades-old facilities with a focus on safety, health and accessibility. We will also add muchneeded learning spaces for academics, arts and athletics on elementary, middle and high school campuses.

The annual investment needed for this plan is \$8.2 million, which would be funded through a proposed 9.8-mill property tax increase. All of the revenue from this tax increase would be allocated to our school system.

Vestavia Hills voters will have the opportunity to vote FOR or AGAINST the plan on Tuesday, May 9. Please make sure to verify your polling location as it may be different from the general election last November; you may visit the City of Vestavia Hills website for information at vhal.org/departments/city-clerk/municipal-elections.



Accepted. Paint* (household amounts only); batteries (household and automotive); light bulbs; and pesticides* (household amounts only). *Paint must be dry; paint and pesticides MUST be in their original containers or they will NOT be accepted.

Not Accepted. Large appliances; wooden console TVs; gas; gas cans; paint/pesticides NOT in their original container

NOTE: Vestavia Hills police officers will NOT be on-site to collect unneeded or expired medications for disposal at this event. Medication collection will be available at the September collection event.

Change is Constant

My nearly 22-year tenure with Vestavia Hills began in November 2001. During my time with the City of Vestavia Hills, we have seen growth beyond anyone's imagination. I cannot begin this farewell address without thanking Dr. Charles A. "Scotty" McCallum. He took a chance on a young, wide-eyed, optimistic recreation director, and the ride has been significant.

Four months into my journey, a group of parents, led by Kendra Veach Thomley, along with over 2,000 volunteers, changed the landscape of Wald Park by constructing a community-built playground in just 10

short days. Cahaba Heights was annexed into the City and, while the facilities were older, they were new to us and much needed. We immediately began planning for growth. While we weren't able to accomplish much of those early plans, there was still a vision. We kept working and striving to improve facilities, but the timing wasn't quite right.

In 2011, a tornado changed many lives as well as the landscape of Vestavia Hills. We continued to plan and grow and added the Sicard Hollow Athletic Complex to the list of amenities in Vestavia Hills. It was a much-needed addition and has been utilized at near capacity since the gates opened.

Nine years ago brought another change to the City – Jeff Downes was hired as the Vestavia Hills City Manager. Jeff has been a mentor, confidant, friend and leader to me. His vision, leadership and drive have changed the direction of this great city. His ability to share a vision, get others on board with the vision, and then secure the funds to accomplish the vision is extraordinary. Under his tutelage, we have accomplished so much, especially due to implementation of the Community Spaces Plan over the course of the last four years. We have built new facilities and completed upgrades to older facilities, all under Jeff's direction.

As I step into a new venture, I can look back and say with great confidence that Vestavia Hills is a place apart, as well as a life above. I know there are so many more names that I could list that have been influential in my time here, but I don't have the space to list them. From the depths of my heart, thank you citizens of Vestavia Hills for allowing me to be a small part of your lives over the past 21 years.
