SUPERINTENDENT'S MESSAGE

Math does not come naturally for most of us. It is, however, necessary in our personal and professional lives. As a student, I could not always make a connection to why I had to learn math. Thankfully, the way we teach the connections it has to our world has come a long way since then. This is good news for our younger generation who have great interest in pursuing future careers in science,

technology, engineering and math (STEM).



Each STEM discipline is unique in how it develops skills of logic, analyzing problems and designing solutions. STEM instills habits of mind that ignite creative and innovative thinking. No matter which

college or career path students take, those skills and habits will be important. The secret to children mastering these important skills is to connect them at the earliest ages with learning experiences that are meaningful.

One example of making connections to learning is the Engineering and Architectural Design program at VHHS. Teacher Steven Brooks says that the program "introduces the design process, practical design and documentation skills. Students can take courses in 3-D solid model design, architectural design fundamentals and architectural building information modeling." Last year, students in the program worked to design a solution for a young athlete who sustained a hand injury to be able to better grip his baseball glove. This was, in part, possible because of partners like our PTO and Hanger Clinic providing resources necessary to designing an idea. That is making a real-world connection to STEM learning with a noble purpose!

VHCS graduates tell us they are interested in architecture and engineering. Each year, typically one in five graduates who attend Auburn University or the University of Alabama major in these fields. More broadly, 1 in 3 graduates who attend an in-state university will declare a major in a STEM-related field. Our community has a similar number of adults who are interested in it as well. According to the 2020 Census, 4 of every 10 college graduates who live in Vestavia Hills earned a STEM-related degree.

Without question, there is a vast wealth of knowledge and expertise right here in our backyard. Imagine the possibilities for designing meaningful learning experiences for children in all of our schools just by leveraging the brainpower within our own community. I invite you to attend one of the upcoming Coffee and Classrooms events to learn more about how you can get involved.


