SUPERINTENDENT'S MESSAGE

The mission of Vestavia Hills City Schools is to provide every student the opportunity to learn without limits. One of our goals is to confront the inevitable challenges students face which create barriers, or limits, to their learning. We have a multi-pronged approach that is grounded in reinforcing the values of our families in developing boys and girls of character.

Author James Merritt says, "Character must be indispensably woven into the fabric of our lives, but this does not happen by accident. We must work hard to cultivate it." Our schools focus on character traits

that equip children to make good decisions, do their best and persevere through challenges. We cultivate this culture of character through community partnerships. One such example is found at Vestavia Hills Elementary East which hosts an annual Color Run focused on the school's core values. The many



community partners that support this event help offset the costs of making character education a priority.

Character is also the foundation for living out the time-honored exhortation to treat others the way we would want to be treated. Cicero said that "within the character of the citizen, lies the welfare of the nation." Virtues such as respecting, serving and being kind to others are common expectations in our schools. The time they regularly spend together, learning across generations, is invaluable in developing future citizens who carry on the legacy of our community.

While character is a necessity to confronting challenges in life, there is often a need for additional layers of support. Merlin, the facility dog who works at Vestavia Hills Elementary West, is a perfect example of such support. Merlin spends his time connecting with and supporting students by encouraging and comforting in ways only a dog can do. Merlin is professionally trained to sense those students and staff who need a little more attention and the calming presence of a friend. Without knowing it, Merlin is modeling the character traits of empathy and respect. West has great partnerships with Pet Wellness Animal Hospital and Happy Dog Grooming that make Merlin's work possible.

Thomas Lickona says, "...in a culture that often undermines good character, schools and families need support from the wider community."
