NEW YEAR, NEW RESOLVE

I hope each of you are enjoying your New Year and that your New Year's resolutions are still intact.

Our city has several resolutions for 2024 and at the top of our list is the redevelopment of properties on the south end of Highway 31. Last March, the City hosted a multi-day series of public meetings, called a charette, to determine the best development use of the former Days Inn site, purchased by the City in 2022. City Manager Jeff Downes is in continuous dialogue with our project's master developer, Village Creek Development, as well as adjacent property owners. We will learn more about this project during our strategic

planning work session to be held February 15-16, 2024.

Redevelopment of Massey Road has been a priority for several years and, following resolution of some legal issues, we anticipate moving forward with resurfacing the roadway and adding sidewalks for the length of Massey Road from Highway 31 to Columbiana Road. As someone that drives this road every day, I can attest to the need for the project.

Let's not forget the Highway 31 pedestrian bridge. This walkway will provide users with easy access to both sides of Highway 31, specifically those visiting Wald Park and the Library in the Forest. This project, first proposed by Mayor Scotty McCallum over 15 years ago, has overcome a myriad of design changes, engineering reviews and multiple rulings by the Alabama Department of Transportation. We may actually see the beginning of this project this year as well.

Last, but not least, is the completion of Altadena Park. This passive park currently has walking trails, adequate parking and a plethora of open green space with a pavilion and restrooms under construction. Future development includes additional trails and a possible canoe launch for the Cahaba River.

During February, we have several dates to remember:

- February 2: Groundhog Day. On this day Punxsutawney Phil, the world's most renowned weather prognosticator, will come out of his house at Gobbler's Knob, and observe the weather. If he sees his shadow then we can expect six more weeks of winter. However, if he does not see his shadow, then we can expect an early spring. You may recall that he saw his shadow on Groundhog Day 2023. So, what will it be this year?
- February 4: World Cancer Day. This somber day of awareness was created in February of 2000 to raise awareness about the disease that is the number two cause of death worldwide.
- February 14: Valentine's Day. While it's certainly one holiday that will warm someone's heart, let's take time to show love to others.
