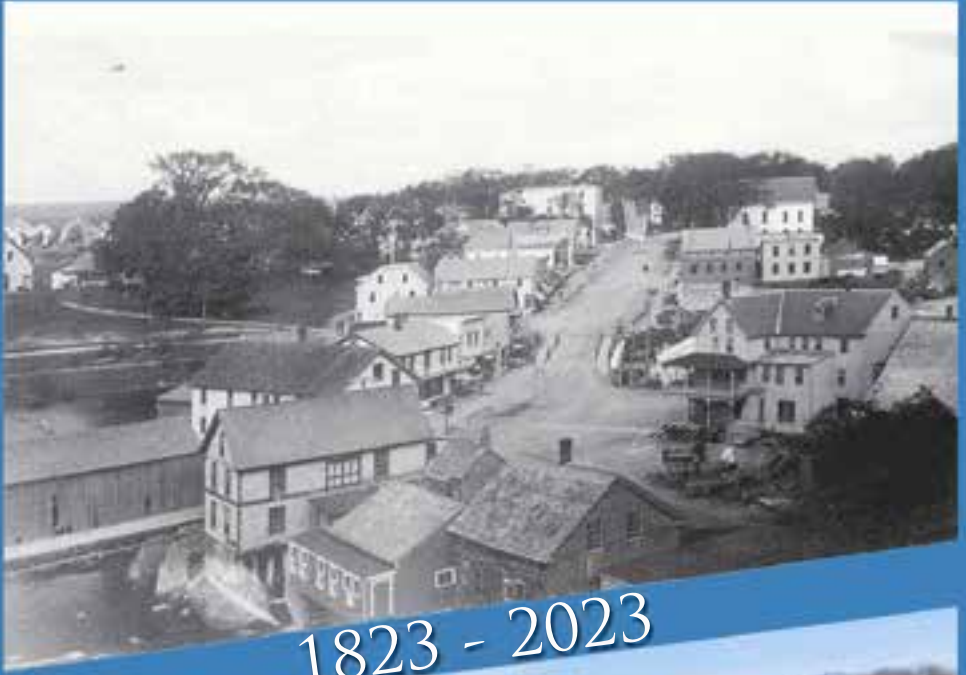
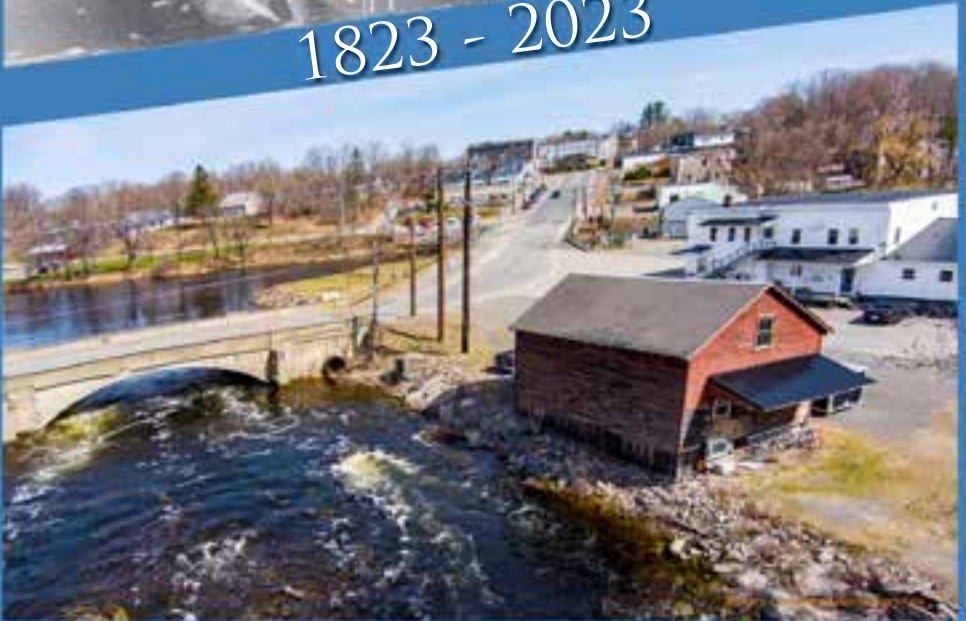

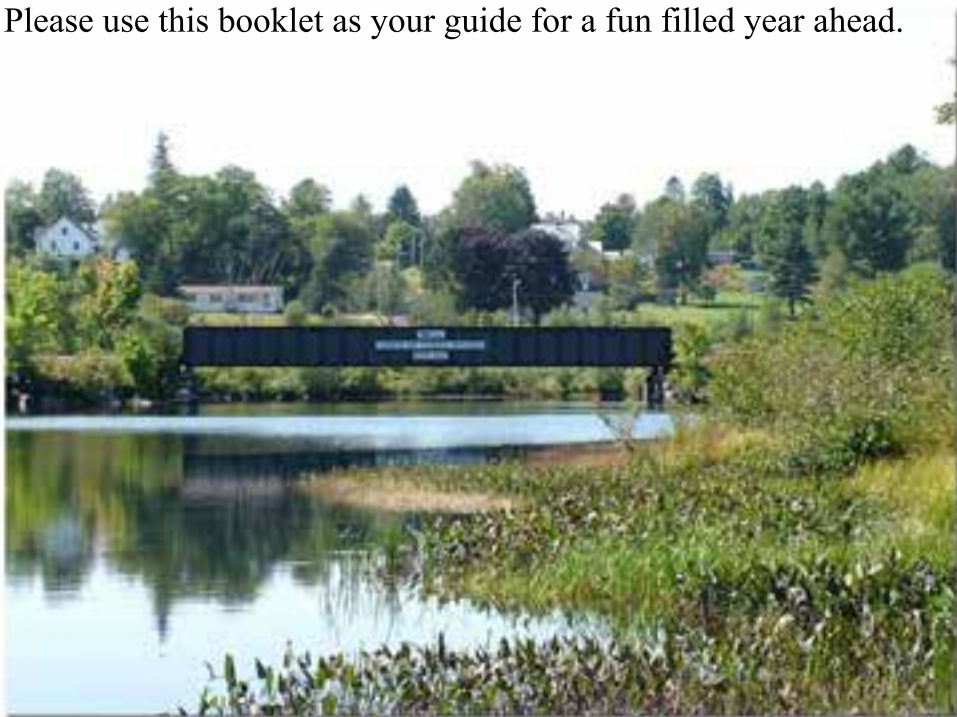

In January, there will be a huge birthday party celebrating Milo's incorporation as a town and also the 100th birthdays of the Town Hall and the Milo Public Library. The celebration will be held at our beloved Town Hall.

The first family to settle in Milo were the Ben Sargents, who came from Massachusettes. Their story of setting down roots near the Piscataquis River has been documented in Elizabeth George Speare's fictional novel, "Sign of the Beaver", an award-winning children's book. You will hear more about this book and the story it tells about the beginnings of our town in the year ahead.

The party starts at 2:00 PM in the Town Hall dining room with games and cake. Upstairs, speakers will begin at 6:00 PM and the band will play from 7:00 PM - 11:00 PM.

Because of dwindling numbers, a few denominations have left the town, and this year the town welcomed the Charleston Church Three Rivers.

The churches are the Park Street Methodist Church, the United Baptist Church, St. Paul Catholic Church, Jehovah's Witnesses, the Apostle Church and the Charleston Church Three Rivers.



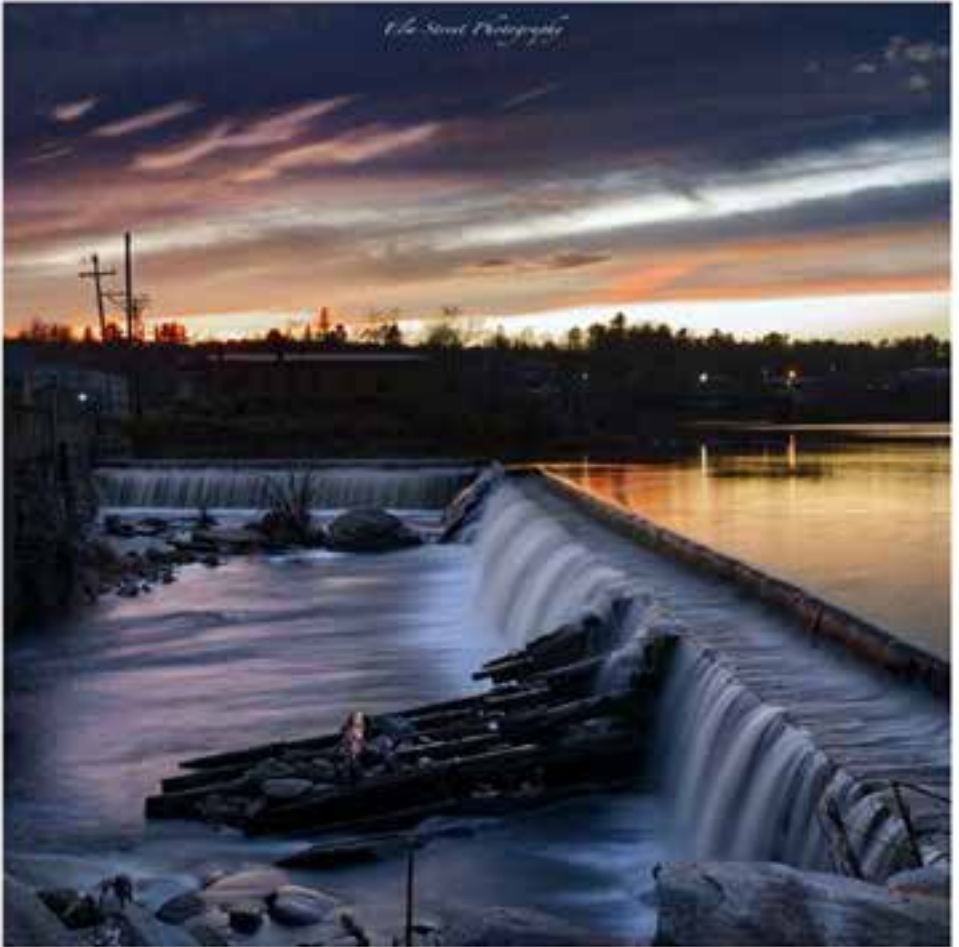

Our club was founded in 1991 with 12 charter members. It has grown over the years with over 50 members enrolled. We are chartered by Kiwanis International which is a global organization of volunteers dedicated to improving the world, one child and one community at a time. Over the years, we have met at various locations, but in 2012, the Harrigans built and donated the Kiwanis Hall that we know today. In the next couple of years, the Harrigans expanded the campus to include the Harrigan Learning Center and Museum, the Milo and North Visitor Center and a storage garage.

Some of the programs that we run throughout the year are the Sebec River Canoe Race, Hooked on Fishing, Annual Auction and Yard Sale, a Cruise-In, Hunters Breakfast, Veterans Day Dinner and our Secret Santa Project which provides clothing and toys to around 100 kids every year. We also give financial support to other local programs, like Reading is Fundamental which inspires children to read, libraries, fire departments, various camps, Boy/Cub Scouts, YMCA/Milo After School Program, various swim programs and many, many more. We also sponsor two youth programs, Key Club in the High School and Builders Club in the Middle School.

We couldn't do all that we do without the generous support of the communities. Our largest donor is JSI, which helps fill our income budget throughout the year. Honor Milo's Veterans

Veterans Day Dinner

Joseph P. Chaisson was the first hometown soldier killed in action during WWI, February 24, 1918 serving with Company F, 103rd, 26 Division, during combat actions in France. Joseph paid the ultimate price and we continue to honor his service and sacrifice. The American Legion Post 41 was named in his honor and his picture is proudly displayed on the Post's wall. Every Memorial Day, a special flower bouquet is placed on his grave site in the Milo Evergreen Cemetery.



January 14, 1937, the Boston Excelsior Company deeded the land and building to the American Post 41. The original building had amazing woodwork, two mantel fireplaces, and a full basement. In the late 1950's a single-story addition was added. The property sits at the intersection of West Main Street and Riverside Street.

It is a separate organization with their own legal and corporate identity. Every spring the Auxiliary promotes the red poppy as a symbol of the sacrifices our military has made. This symbol opens people's hearts and inspires them to donate to this important fundraising program.

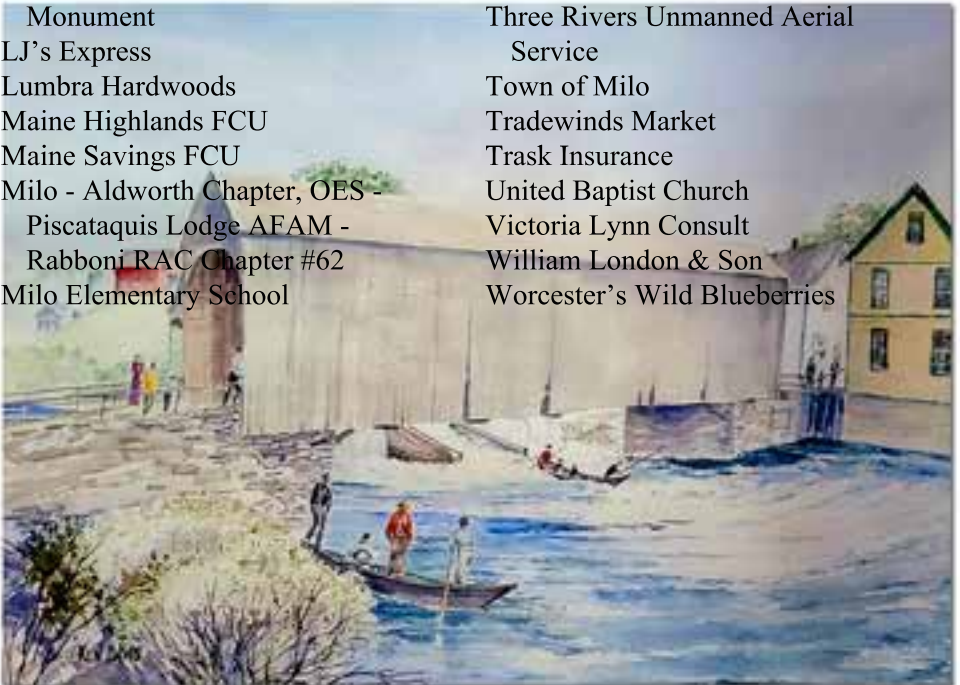

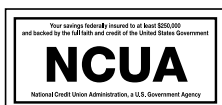

Three Rivers Ambulance Service is currently looking for motivated individuals who are interested in a new adventure, providing emergency medical services to the northern most region of Piscataquis County, located in Milo. Three Rivers is a Per Diem/On-Call service. We have 4 shifts per day starting at 0600 in 6 hour blocks. We average 800 calls per year.

A clean Maine Driver’s License is a necessity. Must be 18 years or older, or 16-18 years holding a valid EMT license.

You must be on the schedule for 36-48 hours per month and attend the monthly crew meeting/training. We have a 6-minute response time per call. If you do not live within the 6-minute response time, we have a crew quarter in the facility.

Three Rivers Ambulance pays on-call and a competitive flat/hourly rate during a call. As well as, compensation for licensure, classes, trainings and CEHs.
