MAYOR'S STATE OF THE CITY BREAKFAST

'Community Of Opportunity For All'

City of West Palm Beach Mayor Keith James delivered the State of the City Address presented by Good Samaritan Medical Center on Friday, Feb. 4, to more than 700 members and guests of the Chamber of Commerce of the Palm Beaches at the Palm Beach County Convention Center. Mayor James spoke on how key quality of life improvements in public safety, education, infrastructure, housing, the environment – coupled with the city's business-friendly environment – are making our city even more vibrant, creating an economy that works for all West Palm Beach residents, and attracting new residents and businesses.

Mayor James' vision for 2022 in West Palm Beach is a "Community of Opportunity for All." This is evident in the 10 great accomplishments the city has obtained over the past year.

- Our city is safe! The West Palm Beach Police Department achieved a 16% decrease in crimes against persons in 2021 and achieved the lowest decreased 22% from 2018. The West Palm Beach Fire Department responded to a record 30,000 calls in 2021. Public safety has been a top priority of the mayor since day one.
- As a sign of its economic strength, the city assisted with the relocation or expansion of 12 new companies, which added more than 1,300 highly compensated jobs in 2021.
- Nearly \$3 billion in privately initiated projects are in various stages of completion, and six Class-A office projects are in the pipeline.
- For the first time in our city's history, beginning in fiscal year 2023,



we will be able to provide full staffing and full equipment, including a new fire engine and a new rescue truck, at Fire

- The "Neighborhoods First" initiative is delivering improved customer service to residents in all neighborhoods. The "Operation Clean Streets" initiative has led to the arrests of nine people for illegal dumping and the removal of 178,000 pounds of illegally dumped material from neighborhoods.
- Through its "500 in 3" initiative, the city is adding more than 500 workforce housing units to its housing stock.

James announced a commitment to add an additional 100 units to a three-year goal for a grand total of 600 units of workforce housing in three years. ■ In FY 2021, \$42 million was

- invested in capital improvement and infrastructure projects benefitting the entire city. We continue to make improvements to community centers, parks, roads and so much more across our city. - Last week, the city was awarded the LEED for Cities "gold" certification. West Palm Beach will continue to be a leader and take necessary actions to address climate change and build resilience. ■ The city is beginning to implement
- priority recommendations from the Mayor's Taskforce on Racial and Ethnic Equality.
- James announced the Mayor's Education Grant Program, a new tiative that will directly award grant to eligible elementary schools in West Palm Beach to help children improve reading and math skills. We are actively negotiating to bring University of Florida graduate, professional and executive programs to our city. An innovative partnership with the Florida Agricultural and Mechanical University will create agriculture programs and opportunities, operate three community gardens, and expand access to affordable health food options in


