## **October Trustee Luncheons**

Katerina Perez, executive director of development and head of business relations for the Alan B. Levan, NSU Broward Center for Innovation addressed the Trustees on Oct. 17. The Center is the world's first theme park for entrepreneurs development engine linking the South Florida region founded as a public-private partnership between Nova Southeastern University and Broward County. The purpose-built 54,000-square-foot space acts as a giant collision station forcing entrepreneurs, academia, industry,

government, funders, wraparound service providers and professional networks to collaborate resulting in local, regional, national, and international impact.

On Oct. 27 the Trustees heard from Commissioner of Agriculture and Florida's 12th Commissioner of Agriculture and the first woman elected to that office. The Commissioner outlined some of her accomplishments during her term (e.g. reducing the background check process for firearm permits to just five days, and ensuring that school boards across the

state mobilized to continue the school feeding program during the pandemic.) She also expressed concern about the selfperpetuating problem of child poverty and spoke about her personal mission to improve the lives of children and families







## Chamber Endorses School Board Referendum on Nov. 8 ballot

The Chamber of Commerce of the Palm Beaches has endorsed the Palm Beach County School District 2022 Referendum that will be on the Nov. 8, ballot as County Question 2. This will be a continuation of the same referendum that was passed in 2018.

The funds are dedicated to enhancing school safety, providing mental health professionals and student mental health programs, funding 750 Art, Music, PE, and Choice and Career education teacher positions, and improving teacher pay to recruit and retain top level teachers.

All referendum proceeds are overseen by an independent committee of citizens and experts to ensure funds are intended for the specific purposes as written in the referendum ballot language. The citizens oversight committee has also passed a resolution endorsing the continuation of the 1 mill plan.

Florida ranks 44th in the nation in per capita student spending. Despite this, Palm Beach County has remained an A-rated school district, thanks in part to the funding derived from the 1 mill plan.

The Chamber of Commerce of the Palm Beaches encourages a YES vote for county question 2, the continuation of the 1 mill plan to fund school safety, teacher and operational needs.
