Business of the Year






Everyday Hero

Nominee must reside in the Woodbury area and shown outstanding public service to the community and/or has positively influenced another's life through compassion, kindness, generosity. Tell us about a person whose good deeds went above and beyond to help others.







Nonprofit of the Year

Nominee must be an active 501-C3 organization located or operating in the Woodbury area for a minimum of three years, a Woodbury chamber member in good standing and made a notable impact on the quality of life for those who live and work in the Woodbury area while adhering to their nonprofit mission statement (mission statement must be included with nomination).





Public Safety Worker of the Year

Nominee must be employed as a public safety worker with the Woodbury area and been involved in an event or circumstance that displayed heroism, community service, bravery or dedication in 2023.

Windows of Woodbury: City Update

A ground-breaking ceremony was held for a new HealthPartners specialty clinic on September 19th. The new 55,000 square foot clinic will be located in City Place, behind the Whole Foods Market. The project is expected to be done by next winter and will provide additional health services to patients in Woodbury, as well as the surrounding communities. The new HealthPartners clinic is the final property to be developed as part of the CityPlace redevelopment that began nine years ago in 2014.
