

NAHB Advocacy: Money in Your Pocket

AHB economists have put a dollar value on selected member benefits and advocacy victories achieved in 2017. Add it up, and you get an average of \$7,500 per housing start for a typical builder.

That figure demonstrates just how much value NAHB delivers for members: the value per housing start a typical builder will see in 2018 as a result of key NAHB advocacy victories in 2017. Some members will experience more of these benefits than others.

Here are some of the advocacy victories that contributed to that number.



OSHA Suspends Enforcement of Onerous Beryllium Rule. Estimated value: \$2.03 billion (\$1,600 per housing start). On Jan. 9, 2017, OSHA published its final rule on Occupational Exposure to Beryllium. Even though the proposed rule did not apply to the construction industry, the final rule did. NAHB filed a lawsuit challenging OSHA's authority to issue such a rule under these circumstances. In response, OSHA announced that it would stop enforcing the rule in the construction industry.



Preservation of Lower Cost Options in Building Codes. Estimated Value: \$1.26 billion (\$1,000 per housing start). NAHB was successful in keeping a number of costly provisions out of the 2015 versions of the International Residential Code and International Energy Conservation Code. Defeated proposals include: Fenestration-U-Factor in Climate Zones 5, 6, 7 and 8 increased to triple pane levels; a high-efficiency water heating equipment requirement; and requirements for new homes to facilitate future solar energy system installations.



Tax Reform: Reductions in Builder Taxes. Estimated value: \$1.51 billion (\$1,200 per housing start). NAHB was involved from start to finish in the legislative

debate over tax reform. On the business side, NAHB worked to reduce taxes on business, including reductions for pass-thru entities, which resulted in lower tax rates and a special pass-thru deduction intended to benefit small business.



Tax Reform: Private Activity Bonds. Estimated value: \$991 million (\$800 per housing start). House-passed tax reform legislation followed early tax reform plans by eliminating the tax-exempt status of private activity bonds (PABs). NAHB worked hard to demonstrate the importance of PABs to the housing market, especially the Low-Income Housing Tax Credit, and the final bill preserved PABs.




Tax Reform: Protection of Builder Interest Deduction. Estimated value: \$884 million (\$700 per housing start). The 2016 Better Way Tax Reform blueprint (published by the Ways and Means Committee as an initial draft of tax reform) proposed to eliminate any business deduction on interest paid on business loans, including acquisition, development and construction loans. Because of NAHB's advocacy efforts, the final tax reform legislation includes a special exemption for real estate businesses from the interest deduction limits imposed on the rest of the economy.



Elimination of Seriously Flawed Duct Proposal. Estimated value: \$867.4 million (\$700 per housing start). NAHB, along with HBA leaders in California and Nevada, strongly opposed a proposed change to the 2018 edition of the Uniform Mechanical Code (UMC) that would have limited the length of flex duct to five feet in residential applications. Recently, the International Association of Plumbing and Mechanical Officials announced that it has decided not to approve this change.

s the dust settles on last month's tax reform debate, remodelers and their clients may see conflicting information about home equity credit lines (HELOCs) and second mortgages — traditionally, important funding sources for major home renovation work.

In a recent letter, NAHB asked Treasury Sec. Steven T. Mnuchin and the IRS to weigh in.

"As most major remodeling projects are financed using debt secured by the buyer's home, the deductibility of interest paid on loans used to substantially improve a home is the lifeblood of the industry," the letter says.

While the new law no longer allows home owners to deduct the interest on HELOCs if they are using the equity for tuition, a new car or a vacation, the bill does carve out money used for "substantial improvements" to their homes, so long as the combined total of their first and second mortgages and HELOC balances does not exceed the \$750,000 limit on mortgage amounts qualified for interest deductions.

While that is lower than the \$1.1 million for the first mortgage and home-equity debt combined before the tax reform measures were passed, it's still useful, said NAHB economist David Logan.

"As long as clients demonstrate that they have used the HELOC for capital improvements on their homes, they should be in compliance," he said.

However, he cautioned, remodelers should not take the role of tax advisor for their clients and should recommend that they call their accountants before making the decision to take out a loan.

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2018 HBAA Legislative Reception

Home Builders Licensure Board (HBLB) Legislation Awaits Governor's Signature

On Tuesday, the Alabama House of Representatives passed SB 147 on a vote of 87 to 3. This important legislation allows the HBLB to license roofers working on jobs over \$2,500, bringing much needed regulatory oversight to the industry. This change will help prevent unlicensed, out-of-state, fly-by-night roofers from infiltrating the state during times of natural disasters, taking advantage of Alabama citizens at their most vulnerable state.

This victory was not possible without the hard work of a number of individuals. Representative Steve McMillan and Senator Steve Livingston worked tirelessly to get the legislation in a position for consideration by both chambers. In the end, Speaker of the House Mac McCutcheon's decision to include the bill on the Small Business Calendar teed the measure up for debate by the House. With members of the HBLB Board in the gallery, as well as HBAA members, the House approved the measure after a brief debate.

The bill is now on the Governor's desk for her approval. The bill has until Tuesday to be acted upon.

Governor Signs Cluster Box Resolution as HBAA Enters Talks with USPS

Literally moments before the HBAA was to sit down with USPS officials, Governor Ivey signed a resolution requesting the postal service abandon plans to mandate cluster boxes in new subdivisions. During the meeting, developers from across Alabama expressed issues ranging from cost to safety to liability as some of the underlying reasons for HBAA and consumer opposition. Among the points raised, the HBAA expressed a lack of any regulatory authority of the postal service to mandate any action by developers. Further, with clear delivery options laid out in the postal service operation manuals, it appeared that the USPS was exceeding its authority to disregard other options in favor of one. The HBAA fought back by arguing that there was no

uniformity to its application of its policy and that the only areas that the USPS references as success cases for its implementation were all high-density, urbanized communities. The USPS even admitted that in Virginia it installed cluster boxes in neighborhoods throughout the 60's and 70's creating a public acceptance to the delivery method, something it is unwilling to do in Alabama.

Additionally, the USPS claims that cluster box installation increases the delivery efficiency by 100%, meaning that they can service 1,600 units in the time they can service 800 under curbside delivery. The HBAA representatives suggested leveraging the cost savings to finance the purchase and installation of units. The idea, which was articulately presented by Todd Slyman, past HBAA president and developer in Huntsville, seemed to catch the USPS off guard and somewhat unwilling or unable to discuss.

At the conclusion of the meeting, the HBAA offered an olive branch of sorts to the USPS by suggesting that perhaps mandating ultra, high density developments install cluster boxes would be an agreeable starting point. The HBAA did, however, state that since public support for this change was relatively non-existent, that they should schedule town hall meetings across the state and alert the public to its plans. The developer or builder should not be the bad guy in this situation, rather the USPS should be up front with consumers about the changes they envision. They have agreed to go back and consider

those suggestions. Until then, the HBAA reinforced its opposition and reaffirmed its desire to find a way forward that did not cost developers extra expense and would be acceptable to the consumer.

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
