President's Message January 2022

I ran for President once before, of my high school, my freshman year. It didn't go so well. I remember rehearsing my speech, for hours. I stood up in front of the entire school and gave what I thought was a very good speech. My opponent got up after me said three words "vote for me", and he won. Good times. Not only was I knocked of the ladder, the embarrassment felt like I got hit with the ladder.

The memory of that speech reminded me that I always wanted to be a part of something great, something bigger than me, something with purpose. As an adult, I always thought that I was one rung below where I belonged. If I could only...sell a bigger job, hire another employee. I always wanted to have a "real" company. If only I could meet the right people.

The right people. I remember my first meeting with Metro in 2015. Tony Volpe from GE was nice enough to invite me for a beer, and the first two people I met were Bill Asdal and Phil Calinda at Grillin' and Chillin'. I had no idea what was going on in that room, or who was who, but the room had a buzz and the people in the room all seemed like they had their act together. I wanted in! Little did I realize the journey ahead.

If I can go back to my high school story for a second, let me just share a fun fact that back then I was the proverbial 98-pound weakling who went to school afraid of his own shadow. In college I stumbled upon a martial arts class, and remember my first lesson like it was yesterday. A 2nd Degree Black Belt showed me how to make a fist. That one moment proved sparked at 35-year journey of practicing and teaching Martial Arts. It has been one of the most rewarding experiences ever. Just two weeks ago I handed out my 361st Black Belt Certificate to a student of mine who is in this room. How was this done? It was by learning one move at a time and by passing it along one move at a time.

The relevance to this is because Bill Asdal taught me my first "move" in Metro. He whispered in my ear "you know you shouldn't give away such detailed estimates, you should charge money for the research you do". Now I figured if worked for Bill, then it would work for me as after all Bill is like a great, grandmaster when it comes to business. To date since we stopped doing free estimates, we've sold \$121,000 for cost proposals. That's been a pretty good return on my investment in Metro dues. All from one idea, in passing, from one person in this room. Since then, it's been a series of incremental adjustments that are transforming our business. I've seen the same thing happen to many of you in this room. Some of you went from driving regular cars to Ferraris. From owning a couple investment properties to full blown real estate conglomerates. From being unsure committee members to power houses leading committees.

Inch by inch it's a synch. Just put yourself in a position to learn, implement the idea, and then hone the skill by sharing the idea. Repeating this process produces excellence.

When I talk to folks about joining Metro the number one response I get is "I'm too busy. I just need to hire someone, or fire someone. I just have to

HELP (REALLY, REALLY) WANTED

Hello and Happy New Year to my fellow Metro members!

Most of you know my background, but for those that don't know about my "past life", I spent 15 years in corporate HR for

two rather large fortune 500 companies. I hired thousands of people during this time. There were plenty of obstacles; hiring IT people around Y2K, hiring "scabs" during strike times, filling large training classes for new hires in the middle of nowhere, etc. but eventually we found the people. It dawned on me recently that while we found the people, it took time, a team of recruiters, brand recognition, placement agencies and huge budgets for job sites. I don't have any of that now.

I've been in construction for over six years and a common theme has been trying to find good help. I've posted ads here and there, hired a few people from referrals. Until recently we mostly were able to manage with what we had. This industry has been booming the last year, and as my company gets more well known, we are being inundated with calls for work. Great news, right??? Only if you have the staff to support it. I never want to be "that contractor" that doesn't return calls or doesn't get back to people but I'm getting close to that line right now.

I do sub a lot of work out, but not everything. Some things make more sense to do in house. And a lot of my subs are also struggling to find good people too.

I realized I needed to think outside the box. I have reached out to many of you for advice or to see if anyone knows anyone that's looking for work. It dawned on me that a lot of people in this field are not on their computers all day, so last week I printed out job ads and went around my neighborhood to pizzerias & delis and posted ads in their windows. I reached out to the lumber yards in my area as well as a big box retailers because I know they're seeing people every day and I'm hoping they know someone who is unhappy in their job and is looking for a change. I reached out to a local Votech school (teaser- the remodelers council will be doing some cool things with them in the coming year!). I hope by the time this is published I have some good news to report from these efforts!

There are many challenges employers are facing these days. I see so many things about the great hiring crisis, unfortunately with no real solutions. The pandemic has changed so many things and the way people think. The workplace advisor at Votech said he has students who don't want to take jobs in their fields because they're making \$1,000/week working 20 hours delivering food! How do we compete with that? How do we get more people interested in the industry, especially when they're being told from an early age "go to college, to grad school."

There are 2 issues I see that need to be addressed. First, how do we deal with the immediate need for people? How

can we help each other? The deeper, long term question is how do we attract young people into this field so we can teach them and help them grow?

We've started to discuss a few ideas within Metro, such as creating an email account @metro for resumes. There is also a job posting feature on Metro's website. Our members should be aware of this and looking at it regularly – you never know when you might think of a perfect match for a job. This is an amazing resource offered by Metro that we should all be taking advantage of! Another group I visited a few times but did not join has a portion of their meeting devoted to "asks". Maybe we can bring a little awareness to who's looking for what in our meetings.

As for the longer term view, we at Metro want to start collaborating with local schools to show kids/young adults there are options out there other than another 15 years of schooling. There are some amazing opportunities in our industry and we need to get them excited about that!

My ask of you today (aside from do you know anyone good with experience that wants a job tomorrow???) is that we all share some of our experience. What has worked? What hasn't? Do you have any advice for those struggling to hire people? Do you just want to vent about it and maybe in the discussion someone will have an idea we never thought of? What are your pain points and how can we all help each other? What do you love about this industry? What attracted you to it and how can we attract others? I look forward to hearing the answers to these questions and working together to build up the building industry!


