Immerse yourself in all Paso Robles has to offer, from wine country, to art galleries, to the great outdoors. With so much to do, let us help you make the most of your three days in Paso with the perfect all-encompassing itinerary.

Day 1

Grab a cup of coffee and a breakfast sandwich from one of Paso's local cafes then stroll through the Downtown Park under the oaks. Check out the General Store and other unique shops around the downtown square for handcrafted goodies and gifts to bring home like olive oil, wine and artwork, or shop at the boutiques for a new outfit for your Paso weekend adventures!

After a morning in the heart of downtown, set out for a day of wine tasting. With over 200 wineries to choose from, there is something for everyone (you will find that a second trip is necessary)! Embark on educational cave tours at Eberle Winery and Robert Hall Winery. Customize your winery tour based on your interests with everything from blending seminars to wine pairings to vineyard hikes. Plan lunch at a winery with a restaurant on site like Opolo, Cass Winery and Allegretto Vineyard Resort or pick up sandwiches at Red Scooter Deli to take with you! If wine isn't your thing, you're in luck – Paso is home to a distillery trail and a handful of micro-breweries.

A nap may be necessary after your full afternoon, but then it's off to dinner! Make a reservation at Thomas Hill Organics to order from a high-end, dynamic menu featuring ingredients grown locally or visit La Cosecha Bar + Restaurant for incredible Latin-inspired comfort food.

DAY 2

Start the day sunny side up at Brunch. located downtown (the breakfast pizza is a must) or saddle up at Cowgirl Café for a hearty American breakfast before hitting the pristine golf courses of Paso. Paso Robles Golf Club is ready to host you for a wonderful morning out on the green. Refuel with lunch at Street Side Paso Robles or Órale Taqueria located on the park.

Relaxing and recharging is just as important as adventuring while on vacation. Schedule a visit to one of Paso's pristine spas or schedule a soak at River Oaks Hot Springs for a lovely afternoon of pampering yourself.



Dine on gourmet comfort food and craft cocktails at The Hatch or modern Mexican cuisine at Fish Gaucho featuring a world exclusive tequila bar.

The perfect end to the perfect day, stroll through Field of Light at Sensorio located on highway 46 East. This outdoor art display illuminates 15-acres of Paso Robles countryside with over 58,000 colorful bulbs, highlighting the rolling hills of wine country and stunning beauty of Paso’s night sky.

DAY 3

Start your third day exploring the Paso Market Walk. With a grand display of market purveyors, there is sure to be something you just can’t leave without trying! Afterwards, grab a beer and a bite to eat at Jeffry's Wine Country BBQ, also known as “The Gem of the Alley” by our locals, and experience some of the best wood fire smoked, made from scratch cuisine from award winning Chef Jeff Wiesinger.

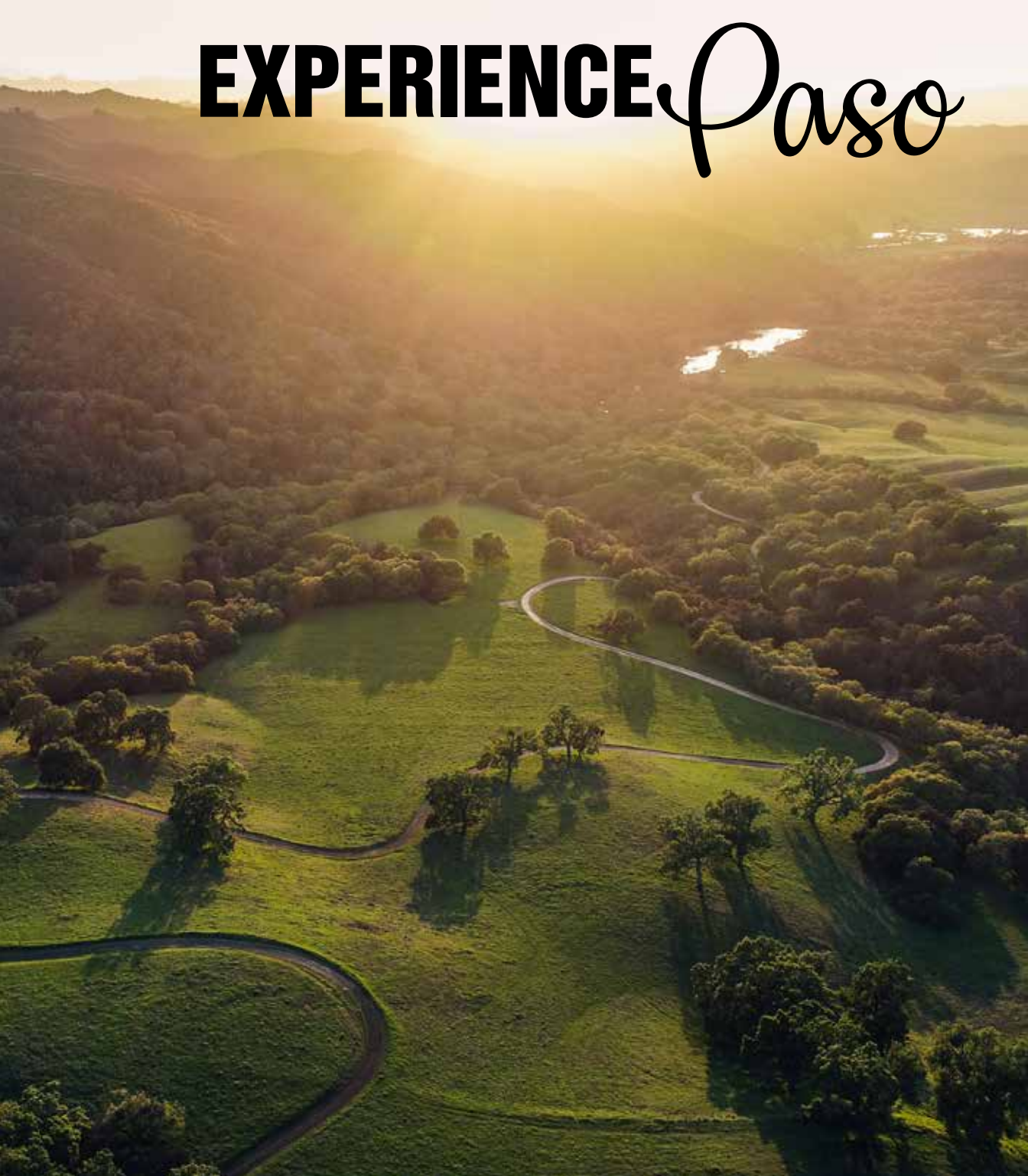

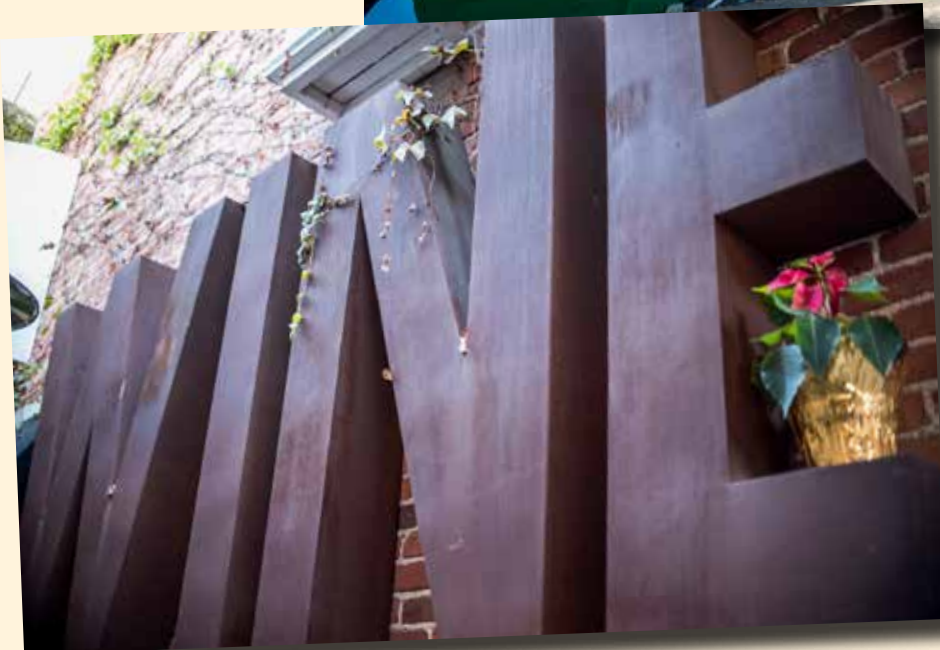

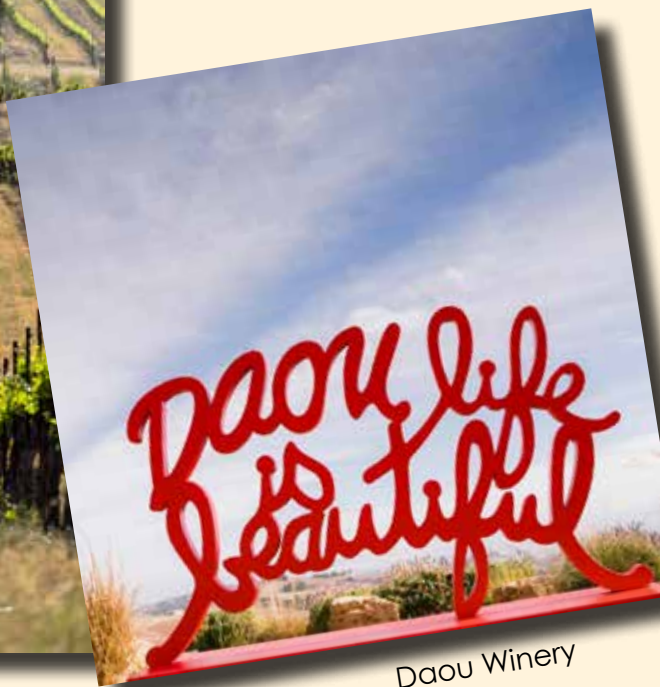

Paso's **RICH HISTORY**

We may be regarded as the hottest “new” wine country in the west, but that doesn't keep us from sticking to our roots. Healthful hot springs, bountiful crops and hard-working cowboys and cowgirls are not just a part of our heritage but are also an integral part of our community today.

Since day one, Paso Robles has been known as a place to rejuvenate and relax. The native Salinan Indians called the region “the Springs,” and in the 1700s they taught Spain's Franciscan padres about the health benefits of the region's abundant thermal waters. The padres, in turn, planted the region's first vineyards and taught the Indians about cattle ranching, farming and winemaking. The Mission-era fermentation vats can still be seen at nearby Mission San Miguel.

By the mid 1800s, settlers of European descent joined the Native American, Mexican and Spanish residents in farming the region. Meanwhile, tourists came in greater numbers to enjoy “El Paso de Robles Hot and Cold Sulphur Springs and the Only Natural Mud Baths in the World,” which had been developed and advertised by prominent local landowners Daniel D. Blackburn and Drury James (the uncle of the outlaw Jesse James), who envisioned a planned spa community.



By the time the railroad arrived in the late 1880s, Blackburn and James had attracted investors to help establish the beginnings of a town with first-class amenities. They saw to the city's incorporation in 1889; designed the town's City Park (then fenced by a hedge of cacti); and, in 1891, built an extensive bathhouse over the Sulphur spring as well as the three-story Hotel El Paso de Robles, which is today the Paso Robles Inn.

During this era, Paso Robles also grew to be called "Almond City" as it possessed the world's largest concentration of almond orchards, a title that would stick until the Central Valley gained access to plentiful irrigation.

The 1880s also welcomed the city's first commercial wineries. Andrew York established Ascension Winery at what is now York Mountain Winery. The Nerellis, Dusi, Martinellis, Busis, Vostis and Bianchis are just some of the other families that launched Paso Robles wineries in the early twentieth century.

Still more attention was drawn to the region in the 1920s when Ignacy Paderewski,



the famous Polish statesman and concert pianist, purchased 2,000 acres and planted Petite Sirah and Zinfandel on his Rancho San Ignacio Vineyard in the Adelaide area west of Paso Robles. And, with his performances at the Paso Robles Inn, he became a fixture amid the inn's glittering scene, which entertained the likes of Jack Dempsey, President Theodore Roosevelt, Douglas Fairbanks, Boris Karloff, Bob Hope, Clark Gable, and even the Pittsburgh Pirates during their spring training.

The city's population hovered at around 3,000 until the 1940s, when the development of the U.S. Army's nearby Camp Roberts infused new people and development into the area. The famed California Mid-State Fair began in 1946 and continues to be a vibrant part of the community.

Today, Paso Robles is a bustling city of more than 32,000 residents in the heart of a wine country with more than 200 wineries and more than 40,000 vineyard acres. Hot springs spa treatments are still available at the River Oaks Hot Springs Spa, and City Park remains the heart of our community.



OUR DOWNTOWN



Downtown is the heart and soul of Paso Robles. It's the gathering place and home for all activities from shopping and dining to seeing a movie and visiting the library at City Hall. Within a two-block radius, visitors will find some of the best dining, gourmet cheese shops, olive tasting, wine tasting, unique shopping opportunities and a charming assortment of hotels.

The town square is centered around the Downtown City Park, a lush grass area with gazebo, children's playground, picnic tables and benches and the acclaimed Carnegie Library, now home to the archives and exhibits of the Paso Robles Historical Society. Throughout the day you'll see the community using the Downtown City Park for picnics, recreation or the latest festival.

Home to the annual Paso Robles Wine Festival, Olive Oil Festival, Holiday Tree Lighting Ceremony, Santa's House and even a fall Spelling Bee, you'll find the Downtown City Park is the central gathering place for the community.

Nearly every weekend sees community events taking place in the beautiful downtown park. Paso Robles is a picturesque place to visit with hospitality that is rarely found in today's world. Experience Paso Robles, Authentic California!



Dive into the exciting past of El Paso de Robles where you will discover hundreds of years of rich history. Mission San Miguel de Archangel, built in 1917, is considered one of the most celebrated California Spanish missions with historic adobe walls and preserved native art. The Estrella Warbirds Museum houses an impressive collection of military planes, vehicles and munitions, while the Pioneer Museum displays fascinating local history along with quirky artifacts such as an old jailhouse door, a one-room schoolhouse and a collection of barbed wire.



Experience wine country from a different perspective at Field of Light at Sensorio dreamt and created by internationally acclaimed artist Bruno Munro. The outdoor art display illuminates 15-acres of Paso Robles countryside, highlighting the rolling hills of wine country and stunning beauty of Paso's night sky. Dive into local art at Studios on the Park, a nonprofit open studios art center located in the heart of historic downtown. The 10 working studios with 50 local artists offer the best of Central Coast visual arts under one roof.

KID ACTIVITIES

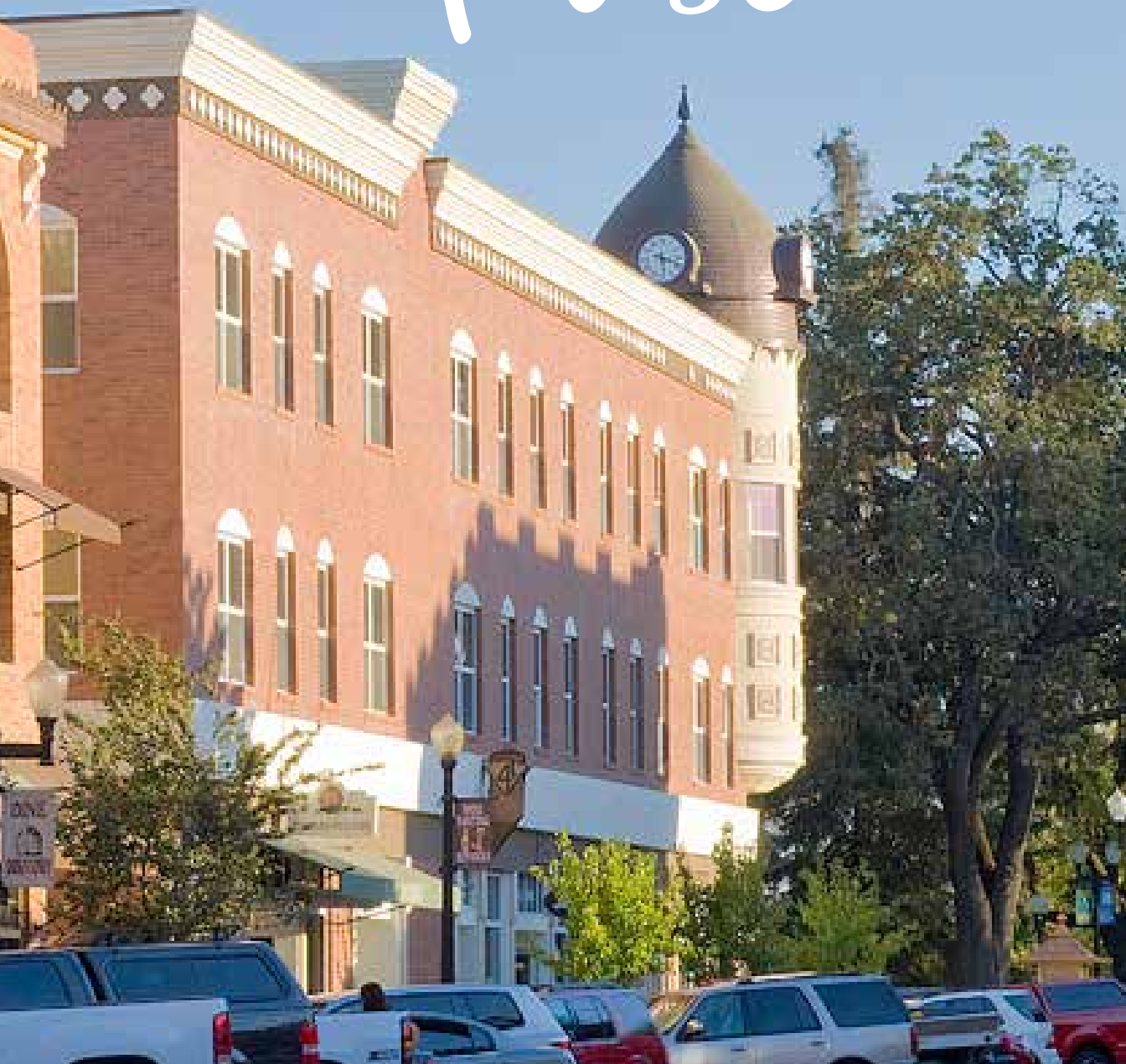

OUTDOOR ADVENTURES

From golfing, biking, hiking, and horseback riding, to paintball and jeep tours, outdoor enthusiasts will delight in the abundance of outdoor activities found in and around Paso Robles. Paso is a short, scenic drive from historic missions, Hearst Castle, world-class beaches and more!

HIKING & BIKING

Set out for a bike ride along country back roads and lightly trafficked city streets in Paso Robles, offering miles and miles of gently rolling hills and natural surroundings. The quaint nearby towns are worth exploring and provide plenty of picturesque scenery (and fun winery pit stops!) along the way.

Trails abound throughout Paso, with options for everyone, from the novice to the hard-core hikers. Check out Montana de Oro, the Lake Valley Loop, Oak Knoll and Quail's Roost trails at Lake Nacimiento, or take the Salinas River Parkway.

HORSEBACK RIDING & DRIVING

Try your hand at driving or riding an authentic stagecoach at Harris Stage Lines, experience life as a rancher tending to cows and goats, head out into the countryside to join trail rides and cattle drives, ride through the hills of Paso Robles on a wine tasting excursion or take a day trip to Cambria to enjoy some amazing views on horseback with Covell Ranch.







GOLFING

The newly renovated Paso Robles Golf Club is now open to the public.

This beautifully conditioned course has the perfect balance of challenge and fun, yet not overwhelming to the average player. The clubhouse has panoramic views from the restaurant, bar and veranda. With live music every Wednesday, Skins Games twice a week and ladies golf on Tuesdays, it's easy to join in on the fun.

Trade in your sticks for a round of disc golf at Castoro Cellars. This course features 18 holes along a two-mile loop, peppered with old-growth oak trees and beautiful views of the vineyard. The scenic course is fun yet challenging, and perfect for all skill levels.

THE PASO ROBLES INN

Established in 1889, the very same year that El Paso de Robles was founded as a city, the Paso Robles Inn has been at the heart of Paso Robles history for over a century. Today, the Inn stands tall watching over Spring Street as a landmark representing the hospitality that our town has come to be known and loved for.

As railroads and mineral hot springs drew visitors to the area, the original “fireproof” El Paso de Robles Hotel was constructed of solid masonry and featured parlors, billiard rooms, a saloon, and even a barbershop. Over the next 50 years, notable figures (and even a few infamous outlaws) including concert pianist Ignace Paderewski, US president Theodore Roosevelt, and actors from John Wayne to Clark Gable flocked to the hotel seeking the comfort of these soothing spring waters.

But in December 1940, a fire destroyed the entire hotel except for the Grand Ballroom, which has since been restored to its turn-of-the-century grandeur. Fortunately, all hotel guests escaped the blaze that night thanks to a heroic night clerk who alerted everyone to the fire.

By 1942 construction was completed on the hotel recognized today, using bricks salvaged from the ruins of the original El Paso De Robles Hotel. Designed to accommodate motoring travelers, the property was described as not a hotel—not a motel, but a combination of both. Because of this unique style, the Inn was featured in several architectural journals throughout the 1940's. The guests' cars could be conveniently garaged just

behind each room, and still allow for central garden views and other fine features of a formal hotel.

In 1999, the Paso Robles Inn was purchased by Martin Resorts, a local family-owned hotel group who immediately embarked on a multi-phase plan to retrofit and restore the Inn. "Our ultimate goal is to make the Paso Robles Inn the landmark it once was," said founder of Martin Resorts, Tom Martin.

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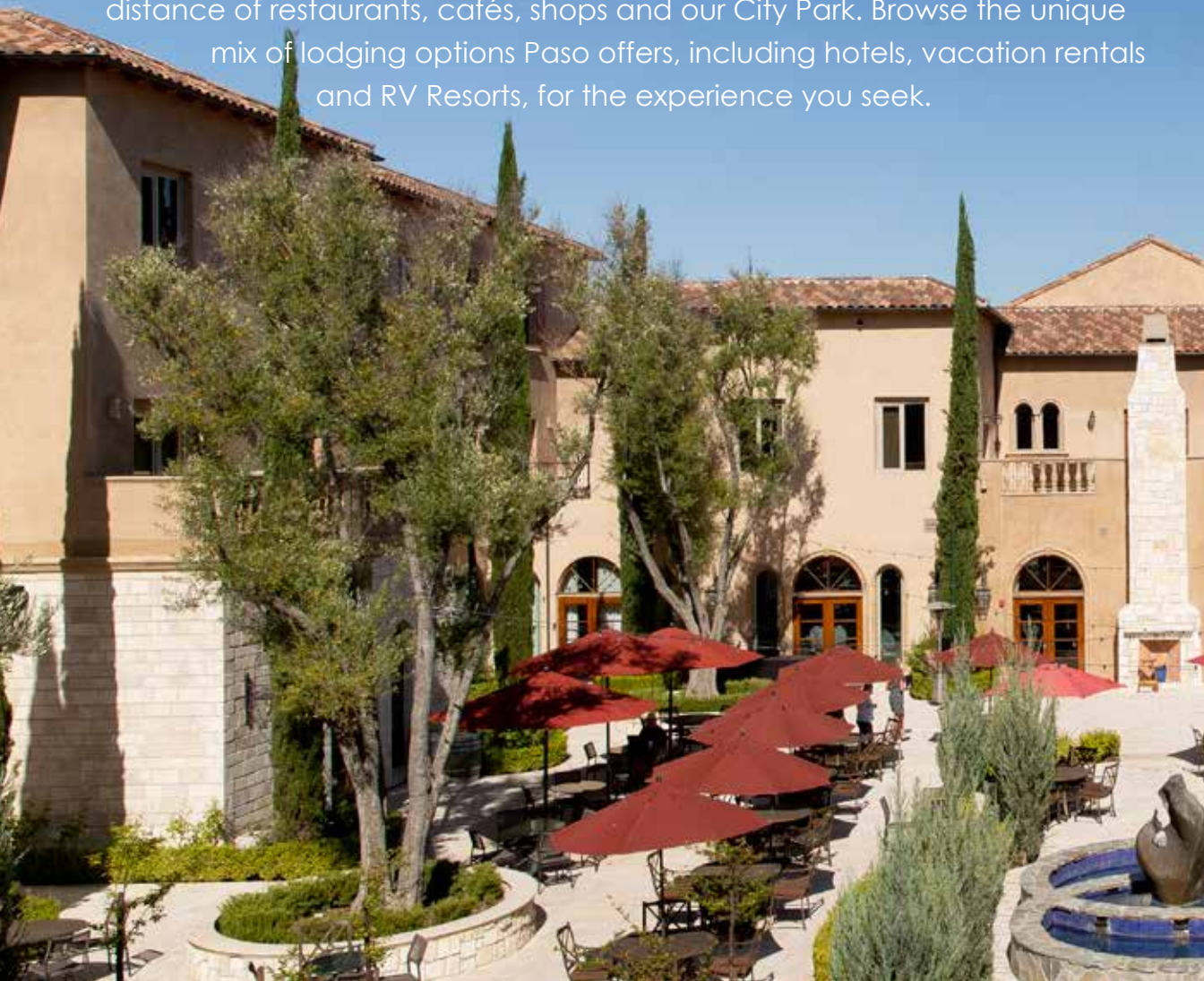

DRIVING DIRECTIONS TO DOWNTOWN

From the North

Take US 101 South. Downtown Paso Robles is accessible by using the 17th Street exit, turn left on Riverside, right on 13th Street, left on Park Street. The center of downtown is the City Park, located at 12th and Park.

From the South

Take US 101 North. Downtown Paso Robles is accessible by using the Spring Street off-ramp. Then follow Spring Street north.

From the East

Take Highway 46 or 41 from Interstate 5 and the valley, they will bring you right into town on 24th Street. To get downtown, turn left onto Spring Street.

From Cambria and San Simeon

Take Highway 1 South. Three miles past Cambria will be Highway 46 (Green Valley Road), turn left going east toward Paso Robles, then take US 101 North.





Downtown Paso Robles is accessible by using the Spring Street off-ramp. Then follow Spring Street North.

From Morro Bay

Take Highway 41 East to Atascadero then US 101 North.

Downtown Paso Robles is accessible by using the Spring Street off-ramp. Then follow Spring Street north.
