CHAMBER DIVISION HIGHLIGHTS & GOALS

The mission of the San Angelo Chamber of Commerce is to foster and promote a business and tourism environment which assures the economic growth and well-being of our members and our community.

The vision of the Chamber is to be the leader in business and tourism by working in unity with all segments of the community.

2019 Chamber Highlights

- **15th Annual Goodfellow Appreciation Day** – A successful day honoring Goodfellow AFB servicemen and women and their families; more than 850 attended the event.
- **16th Annual West Texas Legislative Summit** – Focused on International Trade: Agriculture, Energy, & Transportation; more than 390 participants enjoyed the day co-hosted by Congressman Mike Conaway, State Senator Charles Perry, and State Representative Drew Darby.
- **Business Expo** – The revitalized Expo was held in conjunction with the October's State of the City Chamber luncheon and focused on business-to-business networking, as well as community networking.
- **Diversity Committee** – The Diversity Committee launched a new task force initiative to strengthen and reach five minority groups: African American, Asian American, Hispanic, Native American, and Women. With a dedicated budget for each group, the Chamber will help facilitate an initiative/project per group in 2020.
- **Chamber Website** – The Chamber's website was successfully redesigned and launched in May.
- **Chamber Reaccreditation** – The San Angelo Chamber of Commerce is a 4-Star rated Chamber with reaccreditation required every five years. In an effort led by Peggy Arnold, we submitted a 500-page application for reaccreditation.
- **ALTUS Award** - San Angelo received the ALTUS Award for outstanding community support of Goodfellow. Awarded annually to only one AETC community in the nation, San Angelo is the only city to win the award twice (2014, 2018).
- **Chamber Military Affairs Civic Leaders** -
 - Secured nearly \$5 million in grants that were awarded for projects at Goodfellow AFB.
 - Helped campaign to successfully bring three new missions to Goodfellow: The Center for Excellence for Targeting and Weaponry, The Civil Aviation Analysis Center, and the Artificial Intelligence Training Mission.

ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT GOALS

The mission of the San Angelo Chamber of Commerce Economic Development Division is to grow the economy of the San Angelo area with a two-part strategy of recruiting heavy industrial companies from outside the region and growing existing industrial companies located in the San Angelo area. The focus is to recruit industrial companies that manufacture goods or services locally that are exported outside the region, state or nation.

The San Angelo Chamber of Commerce works with existing industrial companies through our San Angelo Regional Manufacturers Alliance (SARMA) program. The over 100 industrial company members of the SARMA work in concert with the Chamber's Economic Development Division staff to create and implement strategies to strengthen the industrial base of San Angelo.

Since its inception in 2017, the Chamber's award-winning SARMA program has helped to recruit heavy industrial companies to San Angelo, creating high-skill/high-paying jobs and hundreds of millions of dollars in real estate and facilities capital investment.

2019 Economic Development Highlights

- **SMC Global Corporation** – New York-based chemicals company completed third facility expansion in San Angelo and continues to grow.
- **Allens Transportation, LLC** – Edmonton, AB-based heavy-haul company will construct a terminal in the San Angelo Business & Industrial Park.
- **Duke Energy/Recurrent Energy/Canadian Solar** – Constructing Project Rambler, a 200-megawatt, \$180 million solar power generation plant on the west side of San Angelo on FM 2288.
- **Rail Port San Angelo** – The City of San Angelo Development Corporation (COSADC) and San Angelo Chamber of Commerce Economic Development division worked together on the development of a 183-acre tract of land for development of a multi-modal rail port.

2020 Economic Development Goals & Plan of Action

- **Industrial Growth** – The Chamber continues to expand the SARMA manufacturers program for existing industrial sector direct support, new employee recruitment and increased capital investment in San Angelo and Tom Green County.
- **Rail Service** – Develop the industrial rail port in north San Angelo on the Texas Pacifico/South Orient rail line connecting San Angelo to Presidio, Texas and the Port of Topolobampo, Sinaloa, Mexico.
- **Agriculture Sector** – Continue direct support of the regional agricultural sector of the economy with market-access via the planned rail port project, and with the SARMA Ag-Student scholarship and skills training program in partnership with the Texas Manufacturers Assistance Center (TMAC).
- **Corporate Housing** – Source and encourage further development of market-rate, high-quality multi-family housing in San Angelo to provision industrial and other employees with proper and available housing options.
- **Education** – Enhance programs between Angelo State Department of Engineering and regional San Angelo industrial companies with a focus on local workforce placement and further collaboration between ASU Engineering and local heavy industrial companies.
- **Workforce Training** – Continue the SARMA-TMAC manufacturing training courses that are delivered to San Angelo heavy industrial companies by the Texas Manufacturers Assistance Center providing high-level industrial workforce training and certification.
