

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Current Advocacy Initiatives

The Small Business Advocacy Council is fighting for small businesses in Illinois. Headquartered in Chicago, the SBAC's non-partisan advocacy work shapes local, statewide, and federal legislation for small businesses.



The RISE Grant Program

A grant program for small businesses that retrain and hire individuals that lost their jobs or businesses because of the pandemic. The grant is for only net new jobs and small businesses with less than 50 employees. The proposed dollar amount of the grant is \$5000.

Occupational Licensing

- 4 legislative proposals focused on reforming Illinois' professional regulatory process. Included are:
- Guarding Against Unnecessary and Burdensome Licenses
- Eliminating Unnecessary and Burdensome Licenses
- Growing Illinois' Workforce and Tax Base
- Reduce Recidivism and Grow the Workforce

Reduce Recidivism and Grow the Workforce

Advocating for American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funds to be utilized to facilitate the training and hiring of returning citizens. This grant program will provide qualified businesses with 100 or fewer employees a grant so long as they train and hire eligible returning citizens in a new occupation.

<u>Funding for Local</u> Chambers of Commerce

We are advocating for the use of ARPA funds to provide grants for local chambers of commerce with less than 1500 members. These grants should be awarded to chambers which can demonstrate a \$5000 or greater loss of gross revenue from 2019 to 2020. The grants should equal two months of that lost revenue.

<u>Funding for Intrastate Equity</u> <u>Crowdfunding Portal</u>

We are advocating for an appropriation to build an intrastate equity crowdfunding portal from ARPA funds. This portal will be used to encourage local investment in main street businesses and commercial corridors throughout Illinois. The portal will be administered by either the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity (DCEO) or a non-profit third-party vendor.

<u>Funding for Small Commercial Property</u> <u>Owners and Multi-Family Unit Owners</u>

We are advocating for the use of ARPA funding to provide grants to struggling property owners, many of whom may face foreclosure without intervention. These small commercial property owners have been excluded from virtually all relief programs and are in serious need of targeted assistance.

About the Coalition

Thriving commercial corridors support local communities across Chicago and Cook County. Prior to the pandemic, however, many corridors struggled. As Chicago emerges from the pandemic and local communities confront a new economic landscape, a strong coalition of stakeholders is needed to advocate for policies and initiatives which will revitalize, empower and connect commercial corridors and neighborhoods.

This is a collaborative project. The SBAC has formed substantial partnerships to achieve the project goals and objectives. These partnerships are focused on engaging stakeholders to collectively advocate for policies and initiatives which can empower, revitalize, and connect commercial corridors.

This diverse group of partners will provide the project with significant institutional knowledge and broad reach across struggling and disadvantaged commercial corridors. The inclusion of the Uptown Chamber of Commerce ensures the project procures insight and collaboration with commercial corridors on the north side of Chicago. Additional partnerships will be formed throughout Chicago and Cook County. Any additional will be executed only with partners serving struggling commercial corridors in disadvantaged communities.





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SBAC WINS 2021

Chamber Advocacy

While the complex situation on the tax deductibility of PPP loans is where most small business owners focused their legislative concerns, we understood the unique role local Chambers of Commerce play in the advancement of small business interests. When the pandemic hit and 501(c)6s were excluded from all legislative relief efforts, we immediately galvanized support. In our letter to the IL congressional delegation, we assembled 58 chambers of commerce, from all across the state, behind one unified message. This is a true testament in our ability to tailor advocacy initiatives in the most non-partisan and effective manner.

Tax Deductibility of PPP Loans

In April, the IRS published Notice 2020–32 saying that under section 265 of the Internal Revenue Code business expenses paid for from a class of tax-exempt income – a forgiven PPP loan – are taxable. This would have been absolutely devastating for small businesses that were already struggling to stay afloat. Urgently, with the aid of our members and Chamber partners, we used our voice in the nationwide effort demanding a legislative solution. That solution was reached with Section 276 of The Consolidated Appropriations Act 2021. This amended the original CARES Act to clarify that PPP loans are in fact tax-deductible – a major victory for the grassroots effort to save small businesses.

Home Based Businesses

Ordinance SO2021-332 expands the limit on home based business operational space to 300 square feet or to 25 percent of the total floor area in any single-family residence, and more than 15 percent of the floor area of a unit in a building containing multiple dwellings. This allows business owners to unleash their productivity and work from home during the pandemic. The ordinance represents a successful collaboration of partnerships between the SBAC, the IJ Clinic, and BACP.

Public Way Use Permits

The Small Business Advocacy Council and a robust coalition of business and community organizations have been fighting to reduce the time it takes for small businesses to obtain a sign or other public way use permit. They have been calling on policymakers to cut red tape so that small businesses can display a sign more quickly and let potential customers know they are open for business. Mayor Lightfoot and the Chicago City Council have answered that call and come through in a big way! In July 2021, an ordinance was passed that eliminates the need for City Council approval on almost all sign and other public way use permits.
