

RON HAYS, PHD

Ron D. Hays is a UCLA Distinguished Professor of Medicine and affiliated adjunct researcher at the RAND Corporation that specializes in patient-reported measurement development and evaluation. Hays was a co-investigator on the RAND Medical Outcomes Study, HIV Costs and Services Utilization Study, and Project ALERT (a substance use prevention program). He has served as a principal investigator for the AHRQ-funded Consumer Assessment of Healthcare Providers and Systems (CAHPS®) project since 1995. Hays was a deputy editor of the *Medical Care* journal from 1997-2002. He was a panel member for the Consensus-based Standard for the selection of health Measurement Instruments (COSMIN) from 2006-2007. Hays was the chair of the 2005 *International Society of Quality of Life Research* Annual Meeting in San Francisco, an Associate Editor from 1991-2001 and Editor-in-Chief from 2005-2009 for the *Quality of Life Research* journal, and Co-Editor-in-Chief from 2020-2022 for the *Journal of Patient-Reported Outcomes*. He has published 39 book chapters, 17 literature reviews, 18 letters to the editor, 19 commentaries, and 655 peer-reviewed journal articles. Hays was acknowledged as one of the most highly cited and influential scientific minds in each year from 2015-2021 by Thomson Reuters/Clarivate Analytics.
