Current State COVID

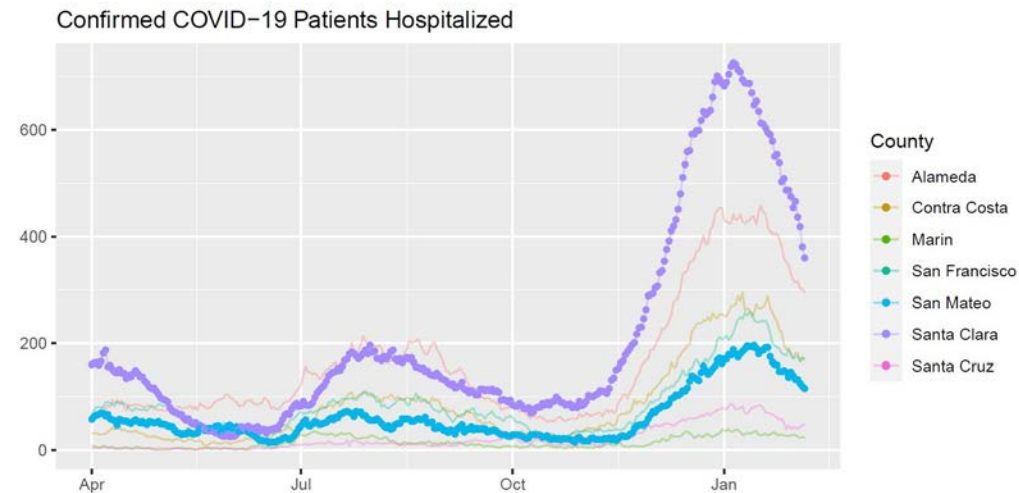
Trends

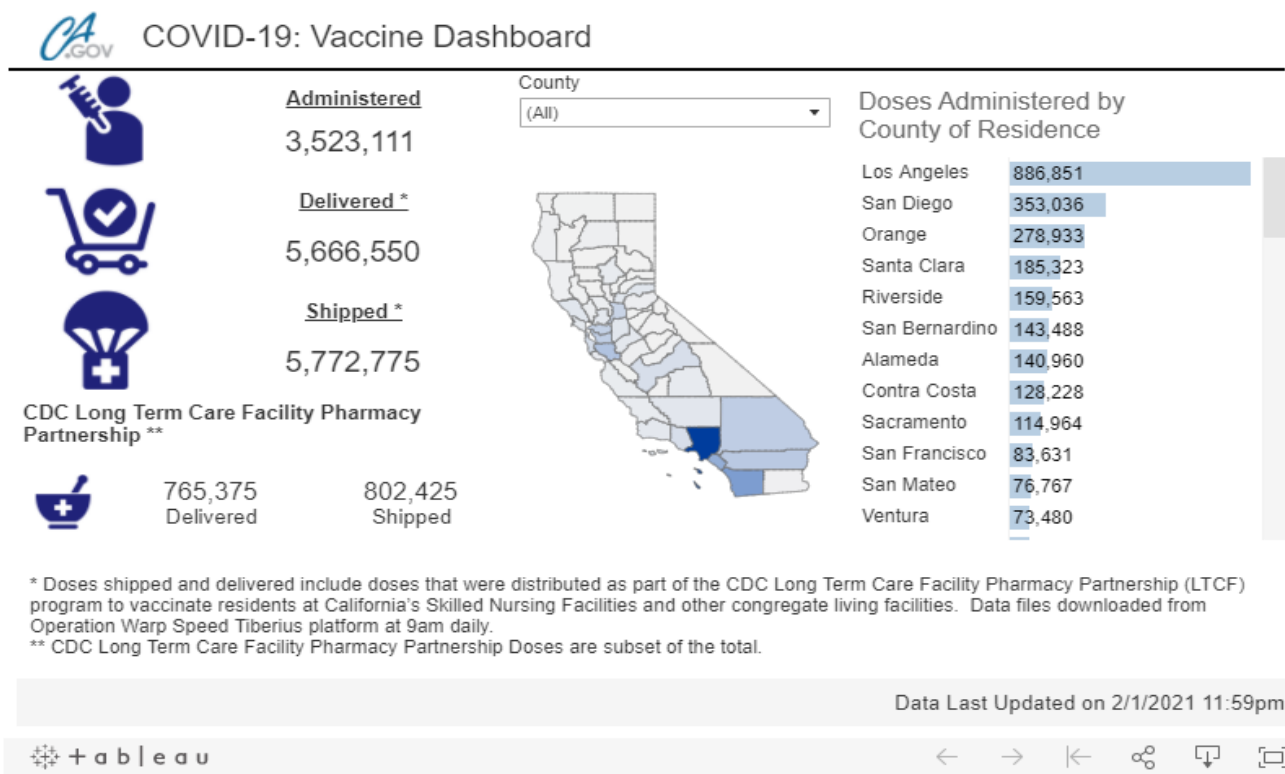

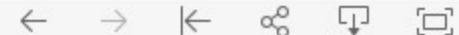
