Tucknott Electric celebrates 50 years in business

pon returning from active duty in the Army, Robert A. Tucknott needed to find a job quickly. He applied to the Electrical Contractors Apprenticeship program sponsored by local Union 595 in Alameda County and began his apprenticeship in February 1964.

After a four-year apprenticeship, he was offered a job as a foreman with a small electrical company in Hayward. He worked a year as a foreman, a year as a project manager and a third year as a general manager of the compa-

ny. It was during that last year when he obtained a contractor's license from the State of California.

On June 1, 1972, Tucknott rented a small building in San Leandro, hired one electrician, and bought three used trucks to launch Tucknott Electric Company. "It was a little scary that first week because I had to meet a payroll and I dumped almost all of my money into getting the business

off the ground," said Tucknott.

"That was a real learning experience that first year," recalled Tucknott. From that point on, the learning experiences were coming fast and furious, and seemed to be bigger and with more risk involved. Through a lot of perseverance, hard

work and never failing to put his key in the door, open up every day, he got the company off and rolling.


Tucknott Electric Company proudly celebrated 50 years in business on June 1, 2022. At its peak, the company employed more than 100

The recession of the early 1980s slowed that pace down to a point where survival was cutting all of the overhead costs and launch working with smaller jobs.

Over this period of time, Tucknott was involved in a lot of insurance repair work, which got him into forensics through offers from insurance company's attorneys. Today,
