ProSomnus Fights a Global Epidemic from Pleasanton

After receiving scans of patients' mouths, ProSomnus uses AI-driven robotic milling with the highest-quality materials available to digitally manufacture devices that are tailored to each patient's anatomy and treatment plan.

OSA is a medical condition that causes people to stop breathing during sleep and can lead to many health issues. It affects 74 million Americans, with 56 million of them undiagnosed. The common symptom, snoring, may seem minor, but OSA is associated with heart failure, stroke, and diabetes. Patients with untreated OSA are 23 times more likely to suffer a heart attack and 4 times more likely to have a stroke.

ProSomnus's devices are critical because patients find the standard OSA treatment to be



reated with Continuous Positive Airway Pressure, or CPAP, but that is uncomfortable and disruptive to patients and their partners. ProSomnus's devices treat OSA by repositioning the jaw during sleep to keep the upper airway open, letting patients breathe and sleep uninterrupted – no masks, hoses or scalpels.

Many of our employees have experienced OSA through family or friends. Helping these patients is personal and it shows; since ProSomnus
was founded in
Pleasanton in 2016 to change
OSA treatment, the company has
delivered more than 187,000 of
its devices to patients, and that is

accelerating.
