- Format: All essays must be typed as part of the scholarship application.
- Length: Your essay should be between 300 400 words in length.
 - (Over word count, your application will be disqualified)
- Please use a legible and standard font, such as Arial or Calibri, with a font size of 12.

□ Option 1:

High school has been a significant chapter in your life, full of experiences and lessons. Reflect on your journey so far and describe how these experiences, both inside and outside of school, have shaped your aspirations for the future. How have your high school years prepared you for the path you want to take in college and beyond?

☐ Option 2:

Think about your high school years as a period of growth and discovery. In your essay, discuss how your involvement in extracurricular activities, academic achievements, and your contributions to your community have influenced your dreams and ambitions. How have your experiences in high school equipped you for what lies ahead in your educational and career journey?

□ Option 3:

High school is more than just classes and homework; it's a time to explore your passions, develop leadership skills, and contribute to the world around you. Share how your involvement in clubs, volunteer work, and academics has prepared you for your future endeavors. How have these experiences helped you become who you are today and influenced your goals for the future?



Interview:

As a part of the selection process for the CLCF scholarship, finalists will have the opportunity to participate in a virtual/in-person interview during April. If you are selected as a finalist, your College & Career Advisor will contact you to arrange the interview. These interviews are expected to last approximately 10-15 minutes and will provide you with the chance to showcase your qualifications and aspirations further. April 4th, 2024 will be the date of the interviews @ Crystal Lake South.

Awards and Luncheon:

The winners of the CLCF scholarship will be expected to attend a luncheon event on April 18th, 2024. This luncheon will serve as a special occasion to celebrate your achievements and the scholarship presentation. You will receive an invitation and additional details about the luncheon through both your personal and school email addresses.

Scholarship Disbursement:

Winners will receive an email with all the important information regarding the disbursement of scholarship funds to the appropriate schools. This email will outline the process for receiving the scholarship award and will provide guidance on how to ensure the funds are appropriately applied to your educational expenses.
