COVID-19 FMLA and Paid Sick Leave Training

The Hibbing Area Chamber is hosting a training on paid sick leave and FMLA requirements passed in the Families First Coronavirus Recovery Act in March. [This law impacts businesses with under 500 employees who would normally be exempt from FMLA!](#) The training features presenters who will talk about federal and state paid leave requirements and answer your questions on who is eligible, if your business is exempt, and requirements around your existing paid leave benefits. IRS Economic Impact Payments and Tax Relief Webpage

The IRS has created a [webpage](#) listing many resources for both individuals and businesses related to federal tax deadlines and the Economic Impact Payments (individual stimulus payments authorized in the CARES Act). The disbursement of Economic Impact Payments has started for individuals who filed 2018 or 2019 taxes and for whom the IRS has their bank account on file for direct deposits. Here are some important reminders about the Economic Impact Payments:

- The IRS will never ask you to pay a fee to receive a refund or Economic Impact Payment. They will not call you to ask for personal information over the phone. Be cautious of [scams](#) that are occurring around tax refunds and these stimulus payments, and share this warning with your friends, families, and co-workers.
- Individuals that were not required to file a 2018 or 2019 federal income tax return may be eligible to receive the economic impact payment of up to \$1200 per individual and \$500 per child under 17. Those that DID NOT file 2018 or 2019 taxes should enter their payment information for the IRS [here](#). Those receiving Social Security retirement, disability, or survivor benefits do not need to enter payment information as it's already on file with the IRS.
- If your bank account is not on file with the IRS, it may take [multiple months](#) to receive your Economic Impact Payment by mail. You can also use this process to update your mailing address if it has changed since you last filed taxes. You can speed up the process and receive your payment by direct deposit by following the instructions [here](#).
