Challenge:

Introduction to social action

Learning aim:

To gain an insight to how social action can play a strong part in developing their skillset, which will help to showcase their skills and personality to future employers.

Learning outcomes:

- Identify ways they can get involved in social action.
- Identify the employability benefits of social action.
- Plan and engage with a social action experience.



'Presenting' is:

"the oral transmission of information or ideas."

Why is this skill important?

Showing great presentation skills will help you share your ideas clearly and in a way that is interesting for the people listening to you.



Differentiation from the initial step 0 to the final step 15.

Success criteria:

Did the learner?

- Identify different examples of social action.
- Identify skills they could develop through social action.
- Identify examples of social action they could get involved with in their local community.
- Discuss with others how social action can build transferable skills for work.
- List transferable skills and provide an example of each skill.
- Identify a job they would do and the transferable skills required for this job.
- Identify how they could develop these skills through social action activities.
- Plan how they will get involved in a social action experience, including contact details and objectives.
- Participate in a social action experience.
- Review a social action experience, identifying their achievements and skills they have developed.
- Celebrate their achievements with others.
- Identify where their skills can be developed and state why.
- Produce an evaluation summary in a chosen format.
