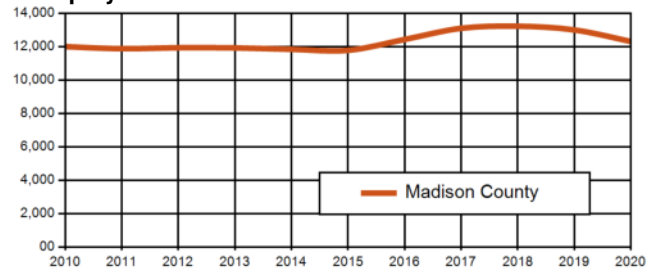

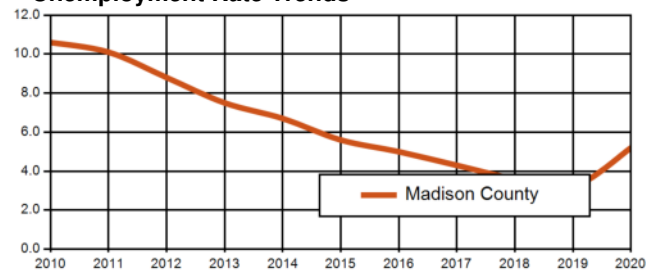

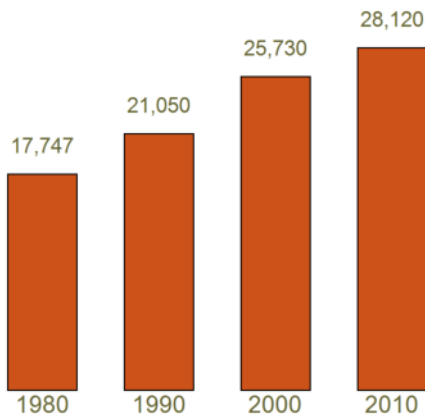
Employment Trends

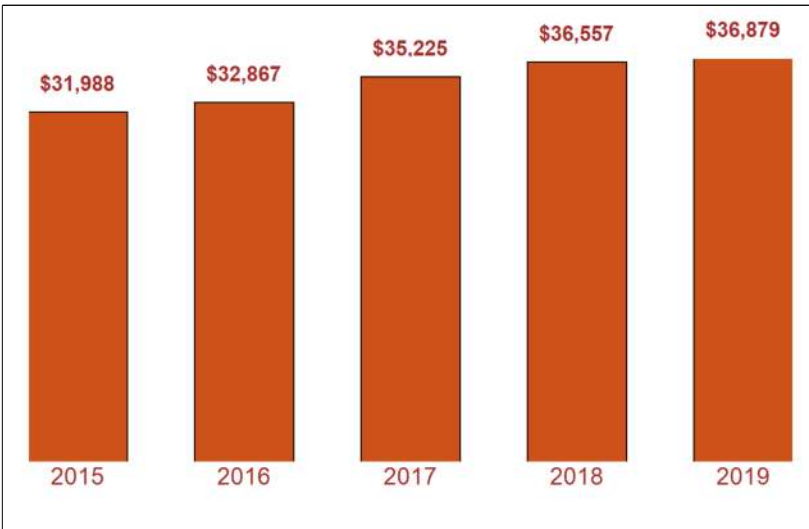

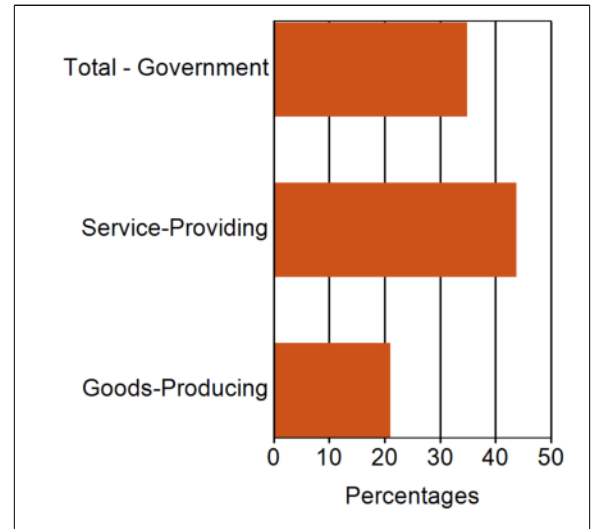
Madison Per Capita Income
