Government investing \$391,500 to help 75 people gain the skills to find good jobs

Aurora — The Ontario government is investing \$391,500.00 in a project focusing on developing and enhancing the skills of participants from marginalized and underserved groups in the Township of Aurora. The project offers a 30-hour fully online Certificate program facilitated by Schulich ExecEd, emphasizing communication, marketing, and networking, to provide free training that aligns with the in-demand jobs with local employers.

The investment of \$391,500 in this project is a clear demonstration of our commitment and unwavering support for businesses and entrepreneurs. It highlights our efforts to foster economic growth in our community," said Michael Parsa, MPP for Aurora-Oak Ridges-Richmond Hill. The Skills Development Fund Training Stream is open to a wide range of applicants, including employers, industry associations, labour unions, municipalities, hospitals and many more. The funding announced today builds on the government's mission to make Ontario the best place in the world to work, live and raise a family.

In addition to the over \$860 million Skills Development Fund Training Stream, the province also <u>launched the new \$224 million Skills Development Fund: Capital (Bricks and Mortar) Stream</u> to build and upgrade training centres across the province.

Quick Facts

- So far, the Skills Development Fund Training Stream has supported 597 projects, aiming to help over half a million people around the province take the next step in their careers.
- Over 237,000 jobs are going unfilled across the province.
- The Skills Development Fund Training Stream is supported through labour market transfer agreements between the Government of Canada and the Government of Ontario.
