A Public Health Approach To Safely Reopen Our State

Illinois Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity (DCEO) has developed a business toolkit complete with signage, training checklists, and other resources to ensure business and activities are conducted in accordance with the latest public health recommendations.

Phase guidelines are broken down by industry and several of them may directly apply to your respective business or organization. These are intended to be a general set of rules and may need to be further personalized to fit your employees and work environment.

With COVID-19 spread in every region of the state, all 11 regions have moved into Tier 3, which went into effect November 20, 2020 at 12:01 am. The state is committed to listening

to public health experts and following the science to keep people safe. Tier 3 builds on the Resurgence Mitigation Plan first released in July to suppress the spread of the virus and ensure hospitals do not become overrun. This new tier aims to limit gatherings and encourages people to stay home to the greatest extent possible, while permitting some industries to remain open at significantly reduced capacities with proper safety measures in place. 

You will be called with results within 4-7 days.

No cost for testing.

### 10 things you can do to manage your health at home

#### If you have possible or confirmed COVID-19:

1. Stay home from work, school, and away from other public places. If you must go out, avoid using any kind of public transportation, ridesharing, or taxis.



2. Monitor your symptoms carefully. If your symptoms get worse, call your healthcare provider immediately.



3. Get rest and stay hydrated.



- If you have a medical appointment, call the healthcare provider ahead of time and tell them that you have or may have COVID-19.
- 5. For medical emergencies, call 911 and notify the dispatch personnel that you have or may have COVID-19.

**Cover your cough** 

and sneezes.



- Wash your hands often with soap and water for at least 20 seconds or clean your hands with an alcohol-based hand sanitizer that contains at least 60% alcohol.
- As much as possible, stay in a specific room and away from other people in your home. Also, you should use a separate bathroom, if available. If you need to be around other people in or outside of the home, wear a facemask.
- 9. Avoid sharing personal items with other people in your household, like dishes, towels, and bedding.







 Clean all surfaces that are touched often, like counters, tabletops, and doorknobs. Use household cleaning sprays or wipes according to the label instructions.

**Local fundraiser shatters record** The Humane Society of McDonough County Brix Challenge 2020, featuring donations from the community, shattered the record of all six previous years' challenges, bringing in \$18,847. For the seventh year animal-lovers in our area rose to the fundraising challenge presented by citizen Chris Brix, who promised to match \$1,000 in funds raised from late September through Oct.



This year's need has been greater than ever, with assistance to animals higher than normal and fundraisers severely limited due to COVID-19. The donations will go to the direct care, adoptions, and fostering of local animals.

# SEXUAL HARASSMENT TRAINING

The Illinois Human Rights Act ("IHRA") has recent been amended and is now requiring: Illinois employers to provide annual sexual harassment prevention training by December 31, 2020 and annually thereafter. It does not matter how big or small your business is, you must provide sexual harassment training to all employees. The Illinois Department of Human Rights (IDHR) has a Power Point or PDF training model that you can use and includes a certificate for each employee to fill out upon completion. You can use their model or create your own training.
