

MACOMB'S 38th ANNUAL HERITAGE DAYS FESTIVAL CANCELLED

(Macomb, IL) – After several meetings and discussions the City of Macomb, the Macomb Area Convention & Visitors Bureau and the Macomb Heritage Days Committee have halted plans to move forward with Macomb's traditional Heritage Days celebration and put the event on hold for the 2020 season. This was not an easy decision as Heritage Days has become a signature event for Macomb and the area over the past 38 years. One that annually draws visitors from around the country back to their hometown for reunions and homecomings. However, it was for that reason among others that the decision was collectively made to cancel the event for 2020.

10 things you can do to manage your health at home

If you have possible or confirmed COVID-19:

 Stay home from work, school, and away from other public places. If you must go out, avoid using any kind of public transportation, ridesharing, or taxis.



Monitor your symptoms carefully. If your symptoms get worse, call your healthcare provider immediately.



Get rest and stay hydrated.



If you have a medical appointment, call the healthcare provider ahead of time and tell them that you have or may have COVID-19.



For medical emergencies, call 911 and notify the dispatch personnel that you have or may have COVID-19.



Cover your cough and sneezes.





7. Wash your hands often with soap and water for at least 20 seconds or clean your hands with an alcohol-based hand sanitizer that contains at least 60% alcohol.



As much as possible, stay in a specific room and away from other people in your home. Also, you should use a separate bathroom, if available. If you need to be around other people in or outside of the home, wear a facemask.



Avoid sharing personal items with other people in your household, like dishes, towels, and bedding.



10. Clean all surfaces that are touched often, like counters, tabletops, and doorknobs. Use household cleaning sprays or wipes according to the label instructions.





The City of Macomb is temporarily changing a liquor ordinance in the midst of the coronavirus outbreak. Macomb officials announced businesses can temporarily sell original packaged liquor through curbside pick-up, carry-out, delivery and drive-thru. This move comes while Illinois is under a stay-at-home order and restaurants and bars are not allowed to offer dine-in services due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Officials said workers selling or delivering alcohol and customers must be at least 21 years old and provide photo ID for proof of age. The temporary measure will continue while dine-in services are shuttered in Illinois

Join the campaign by sharing these videos and information with your friends, co-workers, and family to make sure they are counted. Everyone counts no matter their race, gender, religion, or income level.


