Business of the Month: The Spoon Trade and Grover Beach Sourdough

The Spoon Trade in Grover Beach was chosen as Business of the Month by the South County Chambers of Commerce Marketing Committee, a group of local business owners from a variety of industries. This restaurant was chosen based on their leadership in adapting to COVID guidelines and their success in relaunching their Grover Beach Sourdough location across the street.

In response to the demands imposed by COVID restrictions, the owners of The Spoon Trade, Brooke and Jacob, posted their decision to operate both businesses under one roof in the summer of 2020.

In their Facebook post they announced, "As we move forward we are trying to adapt little by little every day in hopes that we will one day soon be able to serve our guests again in our restaurant. It has been a rocky road and we are still pushing



pretty hard to save where we can and still pay a couple people. We have always had the support of our surrounding community and it is more apparent now more then ever how loved we really are. This is our chance for change and adaptation. Even though we are just barely holding onto our restaurant, we accept the challenge. We are not going anywhere."

Brooke and Jacob were able to reopen their bakery, Grover Beach Sourdough, back in its original location at 236 West Grand Ave. on March 31, 2021. The Spoon Trade is located across the street at 295 West Grand Ave. in Grover Beach.

Update from Supervisor Lynn Compton, District 4: Oceano, Nipomo, and Arroyo Grande

The County of San Luis Obispo plans to demobilize three mass vaccination clinics in Arroyo Grande, Paso Robles, and San Luis Obispo on June 4, 2021. The community clinics have administered over 151,687 doses of the COVID -19 vaccine since December 2020.

Health care providers and pharmacies across SLO County are now offering the vaccine, allowing the County to refocus resources on mobile vaccine clinics to serve those who have faced barriers to visiting a clinic. With this shift, the County will also begin providing the COVID-19 vaccine along with other vaccinations and health services at long-standing Public Health clinics.

"When we stood up these large, temporary clinics, our goal was to administer vaccines as swiftly as possible to our residents, beginning with those most at risk for COVID-19," said Dr. Penny Borenstein, County Health Officer. "I'm proud to say this made the vaccination process easy and fast for tens of thousands of residents. Our commitment to ensuring our community has access to the vaccine has not changed but now that it is available from many other providers, we can shift our focus to mobile clinics."

First-dose and second-dose appointments are available this week at the County's three mass clinics through the State's My Turn system. In addition, the County's clinics in Arroyo Grande and Paso Robles are accepting walk-in appointments during their regular open hours.

Those who receive their first dose of vaccine from the County after May 14 may get their second dose from a regular Public Health clinic or a pharmacy.

"These large clinics have offered a fast, easy, and convenient way to get your vaccine at no cost for months now. It is incredible what these volunteers and staff have achieved for the community," said Dr. Borenstein. "If you're still waiting to get your vaccine, now is the time to make it happen before these sites close."

Update from Supervisor Dawn Ortiz-Legg, District 3: Avila Beach, Grover Beach, Pismo Beach, and San Luis Obispo

Hello residents of District 3! Summer is upon us on the Central Coast. As my favorite time of the year, it is a time of slowing down and enjoying those long summer nights. I would like the opportunity to go over some of the achievements we have accomplished over the last month.

I would like to offer a thank you to our San Luis Obispo County Parks and Recreation Department for their execution of the Cave Landing parking lot clean up. On March 16th, the Board of Supervisors approved adding the land to the County Park System and accepted a grant that, along with other funding, will allow the County to restore the parking lot by adding natural colored rock and gravel to create a better parking surface, install trash cans, place boulders to protect cultural resources, add bioswales to manage the drainage of the site and install accessible parking with an overlook area.

Over the next two to three months, the site will be fully cleared of trash and graffiti with the exception of the interior of the cave area. Further consultation will be needed regarding any potential cultural artifacts that may be present under the graffiti in the cave and the need to protect those resources.

J. Gutierrez of Pismo wrote to me and offered the following comment: "Thank you so much for taking action. I was hiking the Ontario Ridge Trail a few weeks ago and was shocked to see how bad the Pirates Cove area had become. Please continue to keep up the great work and please don't let this drop off your radar" I want the residents of District 3 to know this is on my radar and we will continue to make progress.

On May 18th, the Board approved funding for the Jack Ready Imagination Park, a universally accessible park for physically challenged children and adults. This 30-acre parcel located in southern San Luis Obispo County. While the Jack Ready Park will not be a part of the County park system, it is a very special park which our community, businesses and County have worked together to make a dream come true.

On a sad note, it is with great sorrow our County suffered the loss of, Detective Luca Benedetti on May 12th, 2021. His life's sacrifice and service has stunned our community, and we mourn for his family and for the San Luis Obispo Police Department. The courage required daily to perform the role of public safety was painfully displayed as a strong reminder of what is at stake to keep our community from harm.




SLO Coast Wines' 'Roll Out the Barrels' Celebration is Back

Longtime regional wine event returns after a COVID hiatus, offering its first-ever auction of rare bottles and new experiences at the wineries.

The SLO Coast Wine Collective's annual Roll Out The Barrels celebration, which has drawn thousands of wine lovers to San Luis Obispo's wine country since 1990, returns this year with an all-new format: A series of exclusive events held at member wineries throughout the Central Coast, and for the first time, an auction of rare bottles curated by the winemakers.

All of the events and the auction will take place June 24 through June 28.

As the region emerges from the 2020 COVID-19 shutdown, the SLO Coast Wine Collective is committed to restarting its popular yearly event, but in a way that is safe and comfortable for participants and winemakers. "Roll



Out the Barrels is the perfect opportunity to taste new wines and say hello to our winemakers as COVID restrictions loosen up," says Stephen Ross Dooley, President of the group's Board of Directors. "We're excited about being open again and seeing the people who've enjoyed our wines all these years."

Roll Out the Barrels 2021 will offer unprecedented opportunities for wine lovers throughout the long weekend: Most events will be limited to 10 to 25 participants, allowing plenty of individual interaction with winemakers — and giving winemakers the chance to pour wines made in limited quantities and older bottles pulled from deep in their cellars.

Among the wineries offering tasting flights of older vintages are Laetitia, Baileyana Wines, Edna Valley Vineyard, and Absolution Cellars. Other wineries will extend their hours into twilight, with tastings and tours that immerse you in the beauty of Edna Valley as the sun goes down. Sinor-LaVallee in Avila Beach will be featuring freshly shucked Pacific Gold oysters from Morro Bay Oyster Co, and at Center of Effort Winery, attendees will



Retraining Programs Help Locals Get Back to Work Following Pandemic

SLO Partners has three new training opportunities this summer for local jobs

SLO Partners, one of the leading providers of upskilling and reskilling programs in California, recently announced details of several retraining opportunities for local residents starting this summer. The Precision Manufacturing bootcamp, in partnership with Cuesta College, and the Web Development and Cyber Security bootcamps, in partnership with Cal Poly Extended Education, are now accepting applications and will begin in June. Many jobs that were lost during the pandemic are not returning which has led to an increased number of people looking for work in new sectors. As a result, retraining programs are proving to play a crucial role in getting people back to work. SLO Partners



created the bootcamps after identifying a need for skilled workers in these areas on the Central Coast. "Although unemployment is high, there are areas in our economy that currently have talent shortages," said Paula Mathias-Fryer Program Director at SLO Partners (www.slopartners.org). "This presents an opportunity for locals to gain skills in these areas, get back to work and help plug the skills gap."

The bootcamps are proving to be particularly popular for women, whose careers have been impacted on a greater scale than men's during the pandemic. "We've seen a significant uptick in women enrolling in our programs," added Mathias-Fryer. "One of the major appeals is the remote work-


ing opportunities available in the tech sector. Another is the bootcamps are shorter and more affordable than many other education paths, providing a quicker solution to retrain and get back to work. If you're interested in coding, like to tinker in your garage or solve problems, going to an accelerated bootcamp is a great way to explore if it's something you'd like to do as a career. We're hoping that women who have put their careers on the back burner during Covid, will be able to rebound or find a career path they enjoy more than their previous roles." \$2,000 Women in Tech scholarships are available for the Web Development and Cyber Security bootcamps to support women retrain and get back into the workforce.

One example of a local company who has hired bootcamp graduates is Trust


