March Business of the Month: Grocery Outlet of Arroyo Grande

The Marketing Committee of the South County Chambers of Commerce—a group of local business owners who represent various industries selected Grocery Outlet of Arroyo Grande as the Business of the Month for March 2022.

Grocery Outlet offers name brand groceries for 40-70% less than conventional grocery stores including a variety of fresh, organic produce. Owned and operated by the local Testa family, their store has been involved in the community since it opened two years ago in 2020. They have raised over \$18,000 for the last two years in their Independence From Hunger Campaigns. 100% of the profits staved local with New Life Food Pantry and 5 Cities Christian Women's Pantry. They also give weekly product donations to Altrusa, Meals on Wheels, Salvation Army, and more. They donate unsala-

ble produce to pig farmers. Grocery Outlet was part of the grand opening of the Exploration Discovery Center in Grover Beach. They participated in the Stone Soup Music Festival and Trunk or Treat in Grover Beach. They helped raised funds (over \$500) for a local youth soccer team. They donated pumpkins to Boys and Girls Club, participated in fundraising events with The Clark Center, and supported other local organizations and schools. Owner Haley Testa said they are grateful to be a part of this amazing community.

Update from Supervisor Lynn Compton, District 4: Oceano, Nipomo, and Arroyo Grande

The Local Health Emergency, prompted by the COVID-19 pandemic, that has been in place since March of 2020 has been lifted in SLO County as of February 25th. While the Declaration is no longer needed, the County remains ready to respond to this pandemic and provide resources like vaccines and testing if needed.

My office was recently notified that Governor Newsom issued a press release stating that starting March 1st masks will no longer be required for unvaccinated individuals but will be recommended in most indoor settings. After March 11th masks will not be required in schools and childcare facilities, but will be strongly recommended. Local jurisdictions may have additional requirements beyond this basic state guideline.

On February 15, your SLO Co. Board of

Supervisors voted to send a letter to Governor Newsom requesting his assistance in securing the required state approvals, should PG&E seek to extend the operation of the Diablo Canyon Power Plant. This letter was prompted after a presentation by the authors of a Stanford University and Massachusetts Institute of Technology study titled "An Assessment of the Diablo Canvon Nuclear Power Plant for Zero Carbon Electricity, Desalination, and Hydrogen Production." This study examined how continued operation for the Diablo Canyon Power Plant could provide value in the following areas:

 Contributing to California's zerocarbon electricity production
Providing power to large-scale desalination plant to produce water for drought-stricken areas.

3. Providing a carbon-free source of hy-

drogen production for the transportation and manufacturing sectors 4. Configuring and operating the Diablo Canyon Power Plant as a "polygeneration" facility, generating electricity and producing desalinated water and hydrogen stimulation.

Lastly, thank you members of the Chamber for all you do. It has been an extraordinary two years living under the uncertainty of COVID and has taken an extraordinary toll on our small businesses and small-business owners. It is my hope that this is all now behind us and we can all move forward.

SLO County Libraries of the Future

Our libraries are priceless resources which must be protected, so when the news about SLO County leaving the Black Gold catalogue system surfaced, citizens were naturally concerned. "The landscape of libraries has changed over the years and SLO is in a position to meet the needs of our patrons by reinvesting our funds locally," said Chris Barnickel, Director of County Libraries, explaining why the decision had been made and noting that these are positive changes.

As the biggest financial contributor to Black Gold, the County of SLO Public Libraries has strongly advocated for reduced costs and improved local customer experience, but it has been consistently outvoted by the Black Gold Administrative Council on proposed improvements.

In short, even as SLO County contributed 40% to the Black Gold operating costs, our one vote was not enough to influence improvements thereby limited our ability to provide better services and avoid duplication of costs which was occurring.

2021, intended to speed up the United States' recovery from the economic and health effects of the COVID-19 pandemic.

The Board decided to allocate \$6M of the County's share of \$55 million of ARPA funding towards housing and homelessness. I have been on the designated subcommittee with Supervisor Debbie Arnold to review recommendations from projects submitted by various organizations and nonprofit entities. The final recommendations are as follows:

1. Approve the Affordable Housing and Homeless Funding Recommendations totaling \$4,346,000

2. Approve Safe Parking Program Funding Recommendation totaling \$1,000,000

Projects were selected based on extensive criteria to ensure long-term affordability, demonstrate sustainability of project and supportive services, ensure units are set aside for homeless persons, ADA needs, consideration for proximity to transit for jobs and amenities like schools, market, etc. as well as healthcare services as appropriate to the targeted special needs and vulnerable population interim income housing.

San Luis Obispo County Honors Black History Month

Black History Month was established to recognize the often-missed accomplishments of Black Americans throughout our history. This year's BHM theme is Black Health and Wellness acknowledging the contributions and breakthroughs of Black health professionals and wellness practitioners. What made this year's theme and first-time Black History Month resolution more striking is that SLO County's own Sheriff-Coroner Dr. Joye M. Carter embodies this very incredible contribution and professional skill set.

Dr. Carter is the first Black Chief Medical Examiner appointed IN THE HISTORY OF THIS NATION! She is the first Black female to serve as Deputy Chief of the Armed Forces Medical Examiner Department and was the first graduate of Howard University College of Medicine to become board certified in forensic pathology. We proudly salute her success and contributions!

We also recognized stories provided by the History Center of San Luis Obispo County and the South County Historical Society's military historian Erik Brun to presented "They Faced the Rising Sun: The 54th Coast Artillery Regiment On The Central Coast In WWII." The Black 54th Coast Artillery Regiment arrived from the southern states and was deployed on the Central Coast in early 1942, with a battalion of two batteries of long-range artillery to protect our vital coastal oil terminals at Morro Bay and Port San Luis. As these Black soldiers arrived, they almost tripled the African American population in San Luis Obispo County. I was honored to share a few, although significant, pieces of local Black History however there is much more to learn as we underline the importance of civil rights, strive for greater equality, and empower Black historymakers to tell their own stories. 'LOVE Spay' improves treatment for local female canines

PISMO BEACH — Pismo Beach Veterinary Clinic is adopting a laparoscopeassisted surgery to spay female canines. The procedure is less invasive, less painful, and reduces recovery time to two to three days from the traditional 10-14 day house arrest.

Known as the LOVE Spay, LOVE is an acronym formed from "L" for laparoscopy and "OVE" for ovariectomy. Traditional spay surgery requires an incision of one to four inches on the dog's abdomen. The LOVE Spay procedure involves two to three small incisions requiring just a few stitches each to close the openings. The small incisions accommodate a camera, a tube to inflate the area, and the surgical instruments.

"The traditional spay surgery, like any intra-abdomen surgery, is invasive and complicated," said Dr. Joel Conn, who co -owns the practice with his wife Dr. Sarah Conn since 2009. "The LOVE Spay is a much lower risk procedure requiring less anesthesia."

With an estimate of 65% less pain to



the animal, the procedure uses a cut and cauterize technique instead of tearing the ovarian ligament. There is virtually no bleeding and less trauma to the dog.

"This is a much better treatment for the dogs," Conn added. "It aligns really well with our core values, which include offering the best medicine and highest standards of veterinary care. We will be adopting this technique solely at our practice with all five of our veterinarians."

The procedure is not yet widespread in California, especially outside of major cities. The same instrumentation and procedure can also be used to perform gastropexy, a surgery to prevent gastric dilatation and volvulus (GDV), otherwise known as bloat and torsion. Common in large or giant dog breeds and often fa-

tal, GDV is a condition that occurs when the stomach becomes distended with gas or fluid or food and twists on itself, constricting blood flow to the stomach and spleen.

"To prevent this from happening, we attach the stomach to the abdominal wall," Conn said. "With laparoscopy, we minimize the necessary incision for this surgery from 8-12 inches to less than two inches."

As a service to the local animal community, Pismo Beach Veterinary Clinic will be performing the LOVE Spay procedure on several dogs currently residing at local shelters. "As you can imagine the 10-14 day recovery time is challenging for shelter staffs and volunteers. We're happy to be able to shorten the recovery time and not cause more trauma to already fragile dogs in rescue housing," Conn said.




