have your children enjoy the great playground equipment...enjoy a night out with your community and, if I'm reading Facebook correctly, there might even be an ice cream truck!

With respect to community, the officers and firefighters are constantly serving our community and we all appreciate the work they do. Public safety has been among the most important issues facing Grover Beach as identified by our residents in recent community surveys. Additionally, in those same surveys, the most important city services have been a) rapid 9-1-1 response to emergency calls and b) maintaining fire and emergency medical services. Everyone knows that these services come with a cost – which the city council funds as part of our annual budget and our PD and Fire Authority utilize efficiently and prudently.

For fire service, Grover Beach is part of a Joint Powers Authority with the City of Arroyo Grande and the Oceano Community Services District. Each agency contributes funding to the FCFA and all three communities benefit from having a station in each jurisdiction - so that when a call comes in, the closet station responds so that this needed services arrive as quickly as possible.

When North County and the San Joaquin valley heat up, their residents come to Pismo Beach to cool down. The annual exodus continues this year as well. We have seen large numbers of tourists in our lodging along with day trippers at the beach to the benefit of our fine businesses. Our downtown continues to be a strong draw.

Our historic street paving project is under way. Over the next two years, we will repave or resurface one third of all

the streets in the city. The total cost is \$14.5 million, and it will take about two years to complete. The first phase is to put in ADA-compliant curb ramps. Next will come the pavement grinding or other prep work as needed followed by paving or resurfacing. The project includes most of the streets east of James Way, Mattie Road, Price Street downtown, Wadsworth in Pismo Heights, a portion of Ocean Blvd, and Solar Way. A new sidewalk underneath Highway 101 from

Spyglass to Mattie is also included.

Meanwhile, the Ocean Blvd improvement project in Shell Beach continues to move forward. This project will replace the Morro stairs and stabilize the bluff that were damaged during a storm. The contractor is making great progress which is good news to the local residents who are looking forward to having access to the beach below again.



Grand Avenue vehicle entrance station closes temporarily on August 1

GROVER BEACH — The West Grand Avenue Entrance Station will be temporarily closed to vehicle traffic due to a planned construction project. Beginning Monday, August 1st, the vehicle entrance will be closed to allow the construction and installation of a new park roadway surface which will assist in reducing sand accumulation along Grand Avenue. This project is estimated to last approximately six to eight weeks.

During this construction period, Pier Avenue will be the only vehicle park entrance with expected extended vehicle wait time. Sidewalks adjacent to this project will remain open to pedestrian foot traffic. The Grand Avenue dirt lot, Fins restaurant, golf course, and support parking facilities will remain open and available to the public.




