

Update from Supervisor Lynn Compton, District 4: Oceano, Nipomo, and Arroyo Grande

The San Luis Obispo County Animal Services facility is open as of September 21st. I'm thrilled for this organization to finally be a reality as it has been eight years in the making! This project has been a labor of love, as anyone who knows me knows I'm obsessed with my animals.

This new facility is twice the square footage of our old animal facility. This allows more room for updated medical care facilities as well as improved living conditions for all the animals. There is currently enough room for 50 dogs and 80 cats. A barn is currently in the works so we can expand our animal care: opening it up to horses, cattle, pigs, and small-hoof animals.

The mission of the new animal service facility has a focus on animal care, welfare, and adoption. More than 5,000 animal cases are responded to each year by San Luis Obispo County Animal

Services. Our new facility is much more appealing for locals looking to adopt; the old facility had an open roof and messy parking lot. It unfortunately got overlooked many times and our hope is that more people will find our shelter comforting and more approachable.

I'm honored to have spearheaded this

project at the Board level. They have many animals in need of homes who are all happy and healthy. It is a no-kill shelter and everyone there is dedicated to the wellbeing of all the animals that enter the facility. After eight years of work and many setbacks including COVID-19, I'm incredibly grateful for the opportunity to bring this project to life and share it with all the animal lovers of San Luis Obispo County. I encourage everybody to stop by who is looking to adopt and see what we have to offer as well as the hard work put into this organization by Robert Ruiz and the other county leaders who helped make this dream a reality, including all of the seven incorporated cities, their council members, and the mayors!

Update from Supervisor Dawn Ortiz-Legg, District 3: Avila Beach, Grover Beach, Pismo Beach, and San Luis Obispo

<u>Citizens' Homelessness Accountability</u> <u>Commission (CHAC)</u>

The San Luis Obispo Countywide Plan to Address Homelessness 2022-2027 was approved by the County of San Luis Obispo Board of Supervisors on Aug 9, 2022. To make this plan more robust regarding operational transparency and performance accountability, an organization known as the Citizens' Homelessness Accountability Commission (CHAC) has advocated for the formal establishment of a Brown Act body authorized to interact with the local County government.

CHAC will establish detailed milestones and interim objectives as well as an overarching goal of lowering homelessness throughout the county by at least 50% within five years. The purpose of the Commission is to assist the County by improving accountability; specifically, by providing a citizen-centric perspective regarding progress that is being achieved toward meeting the goals of the five-year plan. This plan will require extensive amounts of communication and coordination between the county, cities, nonprofits, public safety and healthcare institutions, housing develop-

ers, and various state and federal agencies

\$5,925,000 to Community Based Organizations (CBO)

On September 13th the Board approval of the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) Public Health Impacts funding allocations providing financial support to nonprofit organizations, governmental agencies, private business entities, community-based organizations, coalitions, or partnerships to address the negative economic and public health impacts brought about by the COVID-19 public health emergency in San Luis Obispo County

Twenty-seven (27) organizations submitted 31 applications requesting a total of \$13,940,167.65. The Review Committee recommended funding to remodel shower for 34 Prado Substance Abuse Treatment Center, \$78,000 and \$368,000 for the Healthcare Workforce Consortium. Fourteen other projects submitted by local nonprofits were also recommended for funding at a total of \$5,925,000.

A Review Committee, consisting of community stakeholders and SLO County Public Health staff, evaluated and scored all applications according to the scoring criteria. The Public Health ARPA funding will help the health agency achieve its mission of promoting, preserving, and protecting the health of San Luis Obispo County residents focused on food security, mental health for youth, elders, and other vulnerable populations.

Library Card Signup Month

It's Library Card Signup Month, and the County of San Luis Obispo Public Libraries wants to remind residents about the value of a library card. "If you don't have a card or you haven't used your card in a while, now's a great time to discover how much the library has to offer and how much money you could save using the library," said the Library's engagement and marketing coordinator, Erica Thatcher. "A library card is a tool for success in so many ways." Library Card Signup Month is an annual initiative from the American Library Association that highlights the value of a library card for lifelong learning.

Phase 1 is just the start—Phase 2 could bring thousands more acre feet of water. This project is too important

to dawdle. We are all grateful for grant monies received to date, most recently \$14 million! We will continue to pursue as many grants as we can identify in order to reduce direct costs to our cities.

With the Harvest Festival in the rear view mirror, I can't express how fun the event was. There was something special in the air. Perhaps it was simply appreciation for its return after the pandemic? Whatever it was—I want to just give a hearty thank you to everyone who came to the parade, danced at the gazebo, visited our vendors, popped by my booth to chat, and especially to staff and volunteers who made it all possible. As always, this event is "for us, by us," and that feeling permeated everything.

Grover Beach News

As many people are aware, most of the western United States is in a serious drought with San Luis Obispo County ranging from Severe Drought to Exceptional Drought conditions. With that as context, the Grover Beach City Council and staff continue to monitor our local water supply and take actions to ensure we have adequate water for our residents and businesses. At the most recent City Council meeting of September 27, 2022, the Council received a Water Supply Update and Water Shortage Declaration and declared a Stage 3 water shortage.

In short, deepening and persistent drought conditions continue to stress our water supply. The City's groundwater supply and Lopez Lake allocation could leave the City's water supply short in upcoming water years. In order to 'close the gap' in supply versus demand, everyone needs to reduce their water usage by approximately 20% overall. We know that these restrictions will be a challenge to our residents and businesses, however it is critical and necessary that we all do our part to limit water waste and protect our finite water supply.

One way to reduce water usage is through conservation and the Stage 3 declaration strongly encourages conservation as a means of reducing our supply. As the saying goes, we will not conserve our way out of a drought, however, in the short term, it is one of the best ways available to reduce water usage. A couple of ways to reduce your individual

water usage is by taking advantage of our <u>Water Conservation Programs</u> including our "Cash for Grass", "Smart Irrigation Controller", "Toilet Fixtures, Showerheads and Aerators Retrofit" and "Washing Machine Rebate" programs. These programs provide incentives to replace "thirsty turf" with drought tolerant species and for residents to replace older fixtures with more water conscious fixtures.

Another very important method to conserve water is by identifying broken sprinklers within the city. If you see evidence of a broken sprinkler on either public or private property, email our office at publicworks@groverbeach.org

Fall is here already which means that downtown Pismo Beach is not quite as crowded as during the summer season. Cooler weather is welcome also.

We had a great meeting last month with the City Councils of Arroyo Grande, Grover Beach and Pismo Beach to discuss Central Coast Blue, our joint water recycling project. While the meeting was informational, there was tremendous support from all three councils and the public.

On a related subject, our Council discussed our water conservation program given the extreme drought we are in. We gave direction to increase the cash-forgrass rebate to encourage more removal of lawns, and we also asked staff to expand our public outreach.

Our parklet program came to an end on September 30th. The parklet program was instituted to help some of our restaurants get through the pandemic. Unlike some of the other cities in the County, we are a coastal city and we fall under the jurisdiction of the Coastal Act. The Act places an emphasis on coastal access, and the loss of parking to accommodate the parklets could only be justified during the state of emergency due to the pandemic. With the emergency phase over, we had to restore the lost parking to comply with the act.




Welcome Stacy Inman for City Council!





New SLO County COVID-19 data dashboard launched last week

SAN LUIS OBISPO — The Public Health Department launched an updated COVID-19 data dashboard last week to provide streamlined, relevant information that is most mean-

ingful at this stage in the pandemic. This was the first major re-design since the dashboard launched in March of 2020.

"The information we need to make smart decisions today is different than it was two years ago," said Dr. Penny Borenstein, County Health Officer. "We also have access to more dynamic and detailed data than we did when the pandemic began, and we are eager for our community to have access to the most practical information available. This pandemic has challenged us all to remain nimble and responsive to the situation."

The new dashboard will shift the focus from individual laboratory-confirmed (PCR) case counts to wastewater, hospi-



talizations, deaths, variants, and vaccination trends. It will also feature easy access to CDC's Community Levels tracker, which shows each county's level as low, medium, or

high, with corresponding recommendations for masking and other precautions. The new dashboard will strategically use state and national data sources for bigpicture trends while presenting current local data on wastewater and the most severe outcomes of COVID-19. It will include links to detailed COVID-19 dashboards for Atascadero State Hospital and California Men's Colony.

The original dashboard will remain available as an archive.

and identify the approximate area of the broken sprinkler system. When you let us know about sprinkler or irrigation issues you are helping save water from being wasted. City staff will reach out and contact the property owner and let them know of a possible issue with their system.

If we all work together to conserve water, we can make a difference in preserving this valuable and essential natural resource. Your conservation efforts can and will help Grover Beach bridge the water supply shortage until we can build water resiliency and bolster our local water supply through construction of the Central Coast Blue recycled water project. It provides a good snapshot of what the City has done, what we will continue to do, and how we are partnering regionally to make all of our efforts matter.
