

NEW ENERGY CODE - YES OR NO?

There has been a lot of discussion about the new energy code and its affect on the cost of housing. Some say there is no cost increase; some say minimal cost increase and some say substantial cost increase in order to comply with the new code. Whatever the case, if a builder is building a new home in Washington State, the energy code prior to the changes is one of the most (if not the most) strict in the nation. Another issue is that we have different climates in Washington State that many of the other states do not have. The difference in climatology between Eastern Washington and Western Washington is quite significant. On the western side of the state, we enjoy sea breezes that mediate the swing in climate temperatures and therefore provide a more "temperate" climate that is more constant throughout each season. Very seldom do we see triple digit temperatures here on the west side and the same goes for very cold temperatures that are recorded less than 20 degrees Fahrenheit during the winter. On the east side it is quite different with triple digit heat in the summer and very cold temperatures in the winter. There are exceptions to this "normal" that come about when we get our winter storms from the Fraser River Valley plummeting Western Washington and again in the summer when we get the arid winds from the East instead of an onshore flow from the West that helps to temper our climate and temperatures.

All of this being said, what do we do to help mitigate temperature swings that will result in healthy, comfortable homes that are more energy efficient? Over the years, the Washington State Energy Code has changed considerably. When homes were built in the mid-1980s R-11 was the insulation requirement for walls in homes and 2 X 4 outside wall construction was the norm for code construction. Not so today. An enormous amount of research has been done to address some of the issues we live with. This has resulted in updates to the energy and building codes that exceed what is required nationally. We have to build to seismic conditions – never thought of before the last 20 years. And, we have to look at energy usage because it is a known fact that the way we use energy today, the energy sources will be depleted in the future. I'm sure that won't happen in my lifetime or possibly even grandchildren or great grandchildren lifetimes but sometime in the future – no matter how distant it is.

Technology has been the key to our gaining more information about the atmosphere and what is happening to our world as we know it. In most cases all of this has been and will continue to be very useful as we plan for our future.

Bottom line is that we have members who are on both sides of the new energy code. Some don't think it is a good idea right now but could be sometime in the future after we are out of the pandemic. Some don't think it is a good idea at all because we are already as strict as we are. Others think it is the best thing that has happened for Washington in the last decade. Wherever you fall in this debate please keep in mind that everyone is entitled to his/her beliefs and opinions. Just because we might not agree with something doesn't mean we are right or wrong on the subject. Here at SICBA, we support our members through supporting the industry and pursuing regulations and codes that will enhance the construction of affordable housing. There are many different ways of building homes and it seems that whichever is chosen by the builder is probably what is necessary for that particular client/structure.

Whichever way a builder chooses to build is his/her choice. Sometimes the way we build will limit the clientele that can afford what is being proposed and sometimes the end result costs more to maintain than the extra costs up front would have been. Either way, the builder is right for his/her chosen policy and needs to be respected for that decision.

If a new regulation is such that it is not easily understood and the methods of getting to the requirements aren't clear in order to not cost more, we need to start educating everyone that is interested so we are all on the same page and can easily understand the perceived need for change.
