Hispanic facts, data, and trivia



**Aroldis Chapman**, born in Cuba, closer for the Cincinnati Reds, holds the MLB record for the fastest pitch ever recorded in the history of baseball, at **105 mph**.



**Anthony Muñoz**, Mexican-American, played offensive tackle for the Cincinnati Bengals for 11 years, and is the only career Bengal inducted into the **NFL Hall of Fame**.



On July 24, 2014 during the "Salsa on the Square" event, a **new record for salsa dancing with 2,068 people** was established. Congratulations Cincinnati!



The **5 largest Hispanic populations** in metro areas in the US are: Los Angeles (5.8M), New York (4.3M), Houston (2.1M), Riverside-San Bernardino (2.1M) and Chicago (2.0M).



**800,000 young Latinos** turn 18 every year. This means that **2,200 Latinos** become eligible to vote every single day.

**Mexican Wave:** This well-known crowd activity that is performed around the world originated in Mexico City at the Aztec Stadium during the 1986 World Cup.



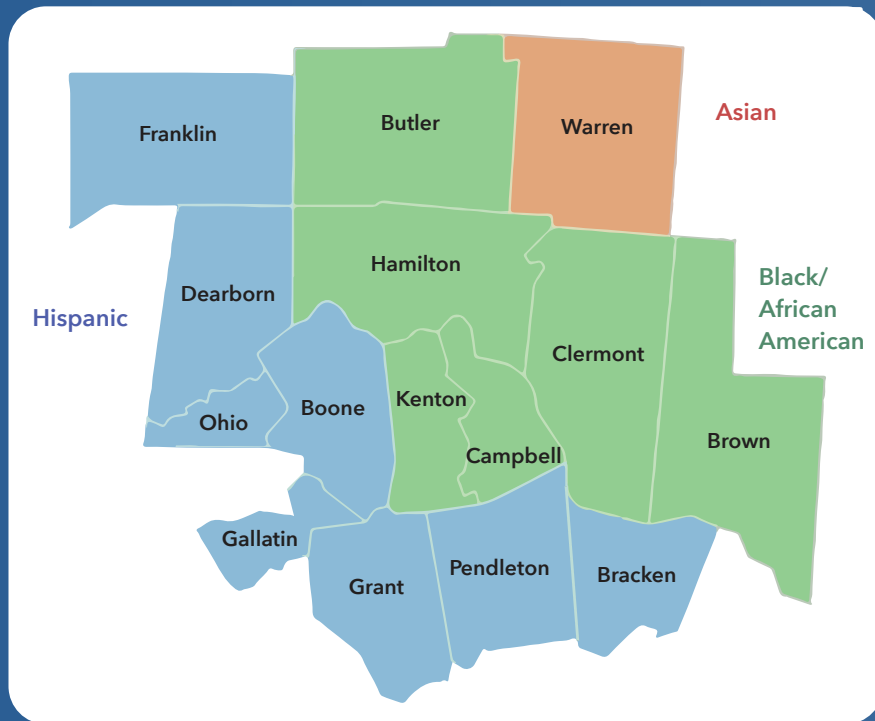
Mexico graduates almost **twice the rate** of engineers when compared to the US. (Ratio of engineers per 100,000 people)

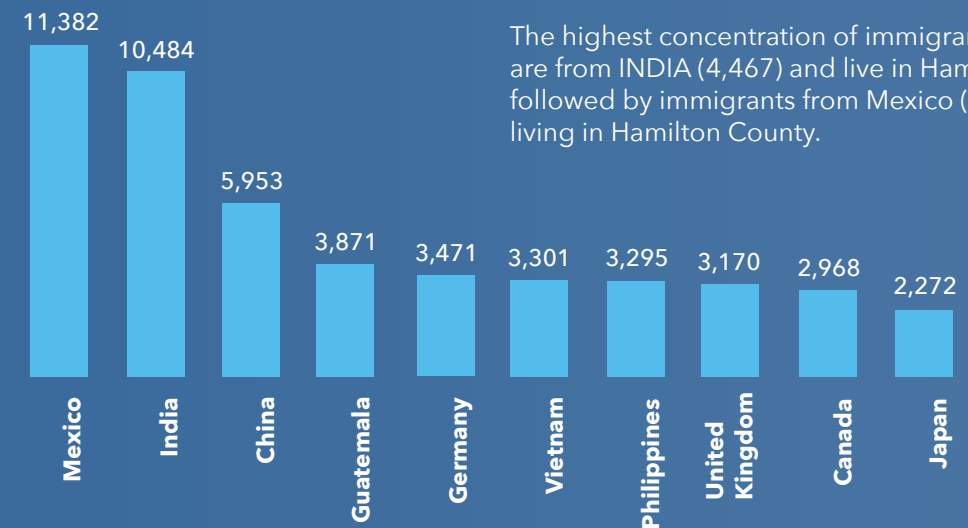

## Cincinnati MSA Top 10 Immigrant Countries of Origin



The highest concentration of immigrants in the MSA are from INDIA (4,467) and live in Hamilton County, followed by immigrants from Mexico (3,933) also living in Hamilton County.

Of the 15 counties in the Cincinnati MSA, **Black/African Americans** represent 68% of the minority population, and are the largest minority group in **six** counties. **Hispanics** represent the largest single ethnic group in **over half** of the counties in the MSA (**8** of 15). **Asians** are the largest single minority group in Warren County.
