

OUR PROGRAMS

Be Kind.

 The first Kindness Campaign took place in 2018 and focused on acts of kindness in schools, workplaces and the community. This campaign now takes place every February, challenging both kids and adults to be kind to one another.

Chambersburg Cares

Chambersburg Cares coalition was formed with the goal of reducing substance use among youth in Chambersburg. The coalition is an active group of
professionals with representation from: religious/fraternal groups, youth, youth-serving organizations, state/local governments, volunteer groups, businesses,
parents, healthcare, media, schools, and law enforcement.

Check and Connect

• Check & Connect is an intervention used with K-12 students who show warning signs of disengagement with school. At the core of Check & Connect is a trusting relationship between the student and trained mentor who both advocates for the student and challenges them to keep education a priority.

Elementary Student Assistance Program (ESAP)

• The Elementary Student Assistance Program (ESAP) can help students experiencing barriers to learning and success. The ESAP team at your school will help you find services and assistance within the school and in the community.

Family Group Decision Making

• FGDM assists families in making and maintaining healthy connections within the family unit. It is also a valuable tool in: helping teens transition to adulthood, supporting measurable increases in child safety, reducing foster care re-entries, improving the stability of placements, and enhancing the capacity for families to provide for their children's needs.

Freedom From Smoking

 Freedom From Smoking provides group support for individuals looking to stop using tobacco products. Classes with a trained tobacco cessation counselor, group support, and nicotine replacements are offered without charge to those who register for the program.

· Go Girls Go!

• Go Girls Go! is offered to various grades and schools within Franklin County. Girls meet twice a week for ten weeks before the final celebration at the Go Girls Go! 5K race. During these sessions the girls learn valuable skills such as proper nutrition, healthy friendships, and much more.

Kids Power Of Produce (POP) Club

• The Kids POP club is a nationally recognized kids program that introduces kids to where their food comes from and empowers kids to make healthy food choices. POP representatives can be found at the North Square Farmers Market.

Strengthening Families Program: For Parents and Youth 10-14

 Strengthening Families is a parent, youth, and family skills-building program that focuses on preventing teen substance use and other behavior problems, strengthening parent/youth communication, and increasing academic success in youth.

Student Assistance Program (SAP)

Student Assistance Program liaisons serve in all of the middle and high schools in Franklin and Fulton County. Liaisons provide one-on-one student screenings
for mental health and substance abuse concerns, group sessions with a variety of themes, and consultation within each school. We support students in school,
but we also connect students and families to outside resources to help them negotiate some of life's stressors.

Teens For A Better Tomorrow (T4BT)

 Teens For a Better Tomorrow is the youth advisory board for Chambersburg Cares. This group of high school students from Chambersburg Area Senior High School and Chambersburg Career Magnet School work to encourage healthy behaviors among their peers.

Tobacco Resistance Unit (TRU)

• The Tobacco Resistance Unit is a movement throughout all of Pennsylvania to help youth, ages 12 to 18, stay tobacco-free. TRU aims to prevent and stop youth tobacco use through peer education.

Youth Drug & Alcohol Intervention

Youth Alcohol, Tobacco, and Other Drug Prevention

The Wildflower Marketplace is a uniquely restored barn located north of the borough of Waynesboro, Pa. Its purpose is to showcase the variety of curated and handmade items from each of our vendors, who, just like wildflowers, bring their own style and beauty to the shop. The 6,000-square-foot space is filled with nooks and crannies to browse on three different levels plus four outdoor sheds that have their own unique style and inventory.

While the shop has been open since 2015, new owners, Brian and Linda Gayman, have taken the reins since November 2021. 
