

Our team has been busy as we kick off 2019, we have several events in the planning stages for the new year, but several of our favou-

for some interesting topics coming to our dinner meetings through the

coming months. February's dinner speaker is the CEO of BC Housing, speaking to the issue of affordable housing.

We mark Chamber of Commerce week in February, celebrating that we have for 88 years continued to provide support, educational opportunities, and a voice to the business community in the Langleys.

We are currently focussing our advocacy efforts on preparation for the

BC Chamber AGM, where we will present and lobby on provincial issues that are also a concern to Langley businesses. We would welcome any input from our membership on is-

sues of concern or specific challenges to business. Topics currently on our radar: transportation, affordable housing, and provincial tax issues - such as the employee health tax and the new speculation tax.

our members a forum to meet in an intimate setting with our local elected officials to create a dialogue on issues integral to the Langley business community – such as economic development, transportation,

and the environment. All our local federal Members of Parliament, provincial MLAs, local mayors, and the chair of Metro Vancouver will be available to meet exclusively with our members during the next six months

Our first Coffee & Conversation event will be held on Tuesday, Feb. 26, at 2 p.m., featuring Township of Langley Mayor Jack Froese.

We are also pleased to be able to present a few special "roundtable" events with federal and provincial ministers that will focus on issues that pertain to the Langleys. The first minister who we

will be hosting will be the Honourable Francois Philippe Champagne, Minister of Infrastructure and Communities, date to be announced.

Concerning business education, we will be hosting special programs to assist our not-for-profit members, a Lunch & Learn series of busi-

ness development workshops, and working with partners on upcoming events focussed on affordable housing, cyber-security, and our annual women's event.

With networking in mind, we have scheduled U40 monthly socials and Business After Hours for the spring, as well as complimentary open house networking events to introduce our community directors. A feature networking event for the Chamber is our annual golf tournament to be held June 6 at Redwoods Golf Course.
