


### **Train Station**







This mural was inspired by a 1920s posteard depicting from left to 48th, 1905 City Hall which also housed the Palatka Fire Department, Saratoga Hotel built in the 1870s, and the 1916 Post Office and the 1918 Post Office Seriology and Hall). The 1888 Forded Seas Coast Ready Endde is shown in the Backdround.

Virint and St. Johns
The hospital opened in 1918, first as a facility for Ahron-Americans. Owned and operated by an Ahron-Americans family, that baseplial was soon integrated. Both black and white patients were cared for by doctors and nurses of both races.








