Scenic, Safe, Welcoming



Enjoy this friendly trail rain or shine!



Approximately 1.75 miles in length, the paved trail runs from South State Street (by the Fire Department) to Nicholas Court, along Sutherlin Creek through the City's right-of-way, offering scenic views and the sounds of wildlife in the Wayne Calder Wetland Conservation Area.

COOPER CREEK RESERVOIR

2.3 miles east of Sutherlin





Cooper Creek Reservoir is a great destination for hiking, biking, boating, paddle boarding or swimming — and best yet, your dog is welcome to join in the fun. The east side features a 6.4-mile all-weather trail, built and maintained by the Sutherlin Rotary Club. Currently on the west side there are a couple of shorter hikes, and a new longer trail is under construction.

FORD'S POND

An open-space, natural community park with safe year-round access

Ford's Pond is a place to enjoy walking, birding and wildlife viewing, fishing, and kayaking and canoeing. This 202-acre property offers parking and a portable restroom. Please adhere to guidelines by keeping dogs on a leash and picking up after them. Pet waste bags are provided at the three entrances.



MILDRED KANIPE PARK

9.8 miles northeast of Sutherlin mildredkanipepark.org

A paved drive and parking area brings visitors next to Mildred's house, a picnic area and public restrooms. The house was originally built about 1865. A nature trail winds around native plants and along the creek bed. On the east side of the creek and south of the day-use area is a pond. There are peacocks aplenty, therefore all dogs must be leashed. As well, bring your own bowl, water and pick-up bags.





Having your dog accompany you to mountain vistas, scenic overlooks, along ocean beaches or through deep forests is one of the greatest joys of dog ownership.

Whether they are romping down the trail on backpacking trips, sleeping in a tent soundly at your feet, splashing in babbling creeks, or alerting you to wildlife ahead, pooches make fine hiking companions.

As you set out to roam with Rover this spring or summer, keep a few important tips in mind:


- Check on regulations. While the majority of trails are open to dogs, several Northwest and National Parks trails prohibit them.
- Maintain control of your pooch at all times and obey leash laws. Some trails allow your dog to be under voice command while others require the dog to be leashed. If your dog has strong prey drives and a tendency to wander, or doesn't always exhibit good manners when approaching other hikers or other dogs, always err on the side of caution and keep your pooch on a leash.
- Be mindful of your pet's waste. If not properly disposed of, dog waste can contaminate water



• Bring plenty of dog treats and give lots of praise. Our furry friends work just as hard as we do out there, so be sure to replenish calories with dog-specific snacks, water and lots of well-earned pats.

from waterways.

- Make sure your dog is wearing ID. Have a clear identification tag on his collar with your contact information in the event your dog gets lost, and ensure he is microchipped in case his collar falls off.
- Carry first-aid supplies and know how to use them.
 Be prepared to treat your canine companion should he get hurt on your adventure. Have a pair of dog booties handy in case of a sore or cut paw and educate yourself on dog first-aid, such as CPR, bandaging skills and reactions to poisonous plants, insect bites and stings.
