Attract workers with Citrus Sign-On Bonus Program

Citrus County small businesses have a new option that may boost their ability to from \$70,000 in CARES funds that were attract workers to fill their open positions: The Citrus Sign-On Bonus Program.

The program is available to all local businesses with 75 or fewer full-time or part-time workers. Jobs to be filled must be full-time positions that pay \$15/hour or less. The newly hired workers must work for the employer for 90 days to qualify to receive the \$1,000 sign-on bonus.

To participate, employers must post the jobs they seek to fill through Career-Source. Likewise, employees must apply for the job through CareerSource. Following 90-days of successful employemployers will invoice ment. CareerSource for reimbursement of the bonus.

Funding for the bonus program comes set aside by the County for economic development uses aimed at boosting workforce affected by the COVID-19 pandemic. An additional \$30,000 has been allocated to the Citrus County YMCA to provide day care scholarships for parents in the same workforce category.

To qualify for full funding, the business must have furloughed an employee for a minimum of two months before rehiring and steadily employing for a minimum of rehire-grant.
