GLORIA'S GEMS

Domestic violence in families can often be hidden for years from family, friends and neighbors. Statistically 80% of abuse incidents go unreported in MN. Yet its impact on those verball, physically or sexually abused can be detrimental for years.

Like other non-profits members, Rivers of Hope had to delay their fall GALA fundraiser until next spring. While they were able to receive Sherburne County CARES funds, they still need to raise funds for operating expenses. Nov 19th is Minnesota's Give to the Max. Please consider supporting Rivers of Hope & other non-profit members.

MEMBER OF THE MONTH:

Rivers of Hope was founded as a non-profit organization in 1989 concerned about domestic violence in families but particularly how it impacted children. Their first office was in Elk River and they moved to Monticello as they expanded services to both Sherburne and Wright Counties. They have 8 full-time and 2 part-time staff working with adults, teens and children along with 3 volunteers "manning" the Crisis Line.

In addition to working with family or domestic violence, they also provide services for intimate partner violence, teen dating violence and bullying on a personal nature. Violence can be physical, emotional, sexual, even financial, or a combination of these. The abuser uses a pattern of behaviors and tactics to gain and maintain power and control over a current or former intimate partner or children.

Speaking at the Chamber's October membership meeting, Executive Director Teresa McNamee indicated that their monthly caseload has increased 50% this year. And she noted, "75% of em-

ployed victim survivors are harassed by their abusers at work. Please contact me for resources about workplace safety.

"I'm thankful for the local support we have for our programs," McNamee concluded. Check out their website is here!





YOUR VOICE IN GOVERNMENT

BILL INCLUDES SECTION 179 CONFORMITY

MINNESOTA CHAMBER OF COMMERCE

On Thursday, October 15, the Legislature passed a bill to conform to section 179 expensing effective for tax year 2020 providing **\$208 million in tax relief for small businesses** and farmers over the next three years. The Minnesota Chamber has advocated for this law change for the past three sessions and we are pleased it has been accomplished.

ADDITIONAL RESTRICTIONS ON GATHERINGS

Governor Walz announced that effective Friday, Nov 12 at 10 pm all social gatherings of more than 10 persons of more than 3 households are prohibited to stem the increases in COVID-19. Venues such as bars, restaurants and event centers can host celebrations except from 10 pm- 4 am and they must have a COVID-Preparedness Plan. Starting Nov. 28th groups are limited to 50 people until Dec. 11th at 10 pm when they are restricted to 25. Occupancy is restricted to 50% capacity with a maximum of 150. COVID-19 UPDATE

Sherburne County COVID cases: as of Nov 10th, we've had 2914 confirmed cases (an increase of 1600 in 1 month) and 29 deaths (an increase of 13). The county's 7-day daily average count is 131 compared to 12.6 last month. Big Lake's cases total 547 compared to 244 in October and 163 in September. Check it out here!




LOTS OF CHRISTMAS LIGHTS IN BROWNS PARK!
