

COVID-19 UPDATE

Sherburne County COVID cases: as of Feb 23rd, we've had 8642 confirmed cases compared to 7617 on Dec. 30th with 80 deaths compared to 77 last month and 29 deaths in Nov. The county's 7-day daily average count is 10.1 compared to 16.9 last month, 30 on Dec. 30th, 92.6 on Dec. 9th and a high of 291 in mid-Nov. Average age is 39.5. Big Lake's cases totaling 1700 is same as last month compared to 1500 on Dec. 30th, 547 in Nov, 244 in Oct. and 163 in Sept. Check it out here! As of 2/23, 7408 persons in Sherburne County have received at least one dose of vaccine and 3230 have completed the series.

Vaccine Connector: The Minnesota COVID-19 Vaccine Connector is a tool that helps Minnesotans find out when, where, and how to get a COVID-19 vaccine. Register here! After you fill out a simple form, the Vaccine Connector will:

- -alert you when you are eligible to receive a vaccine;
