

# YOUR VOICE

### **MN Special Session Ends Governor's Emergency Powers**

Both the MN House and Senate approved ending Governor Walz's Emergency Powers effective July 1st, which the Big Lake Chamber Board approved months ago. Other decisions during the Special Session include:

- \$52 billion budget for next 2 years
- \$2.3 billion in rainy day fund along with \$2 billion unspent from federal American Rescue Plan and potentially \$2+ billion in tax surplus. May's tax receipts were \$1.8 billion more than projected.
- Tax conformity and credits to businesses receiving federal Payroll Protection Plan (PPP) funds and workers receiving unemployment
- Reinsurance Program at 75% of previous years continued for another year (and supported by Big Lake Chamber Board)
- 4.5% increase in general fund for school districts during next 2 years, the largest increase in a decade.



# New City of Big Lake Police Chief

The Big Lake City Council approved the appointment of Matt Hayen as Police Chief late last month. Hayen has been Acting Police Chief since late 2020. Congratulations Matt!

### **COVID-19 UPDATE**

**Sherburne County** COVID cases: as of July 1st, we've had just 95 more cases at 12,032 compared to last month's 11,937, 11,401 in May, 8642 in late Feb, and 7617 in Dec. We have only 2 more deaths at 102 than last month and 10 more deaths than May; there were 80 deaths in late Feb, and 29 deaths in Nov. Likely due to more vaccinations, the county's 7-day average count has dropped to 0 compared to 6.1 in June, 39.9 in May, 46.9 in April, 92.6 on Dec. 9th and a high of 174 in mid-Nov. Average age was the same as last month at 38.3, similar to the last 3 months. Big Lake's cases remain the same as last month at 2400 compared to 2300 in May, 1700 in Feb and Jan, 1500 in Dec, 547 in Nov, 244 in Oct. and 163 in Sept. 36,407 persons in Sherburne County have received at least one dose of vaccine and 34,508 have completed the series. Spud Fest's online carnival ride voucher presales in partnership with the Chamber greatly exceeded expectations as nearly \$6900 for 231 vouchers were purchased compared to a goal of \$1000 for this first-time venture! 76% of this amount was purchased on the last day!
