

The voters in the Big Lake School District area voted on or before a Special School Election on Nov. 2nd.

Superintendent Tim Truebenbach announced that evening that "today our community made a historic decision to restore and renew our current district facilities! The school bond referendum passed 1,011 to 776. The passage of this \$30 million bond referendum will allow us to enact a plan to restore and renew our school facilities for future generations while maintaining fiscal responsibility for our tax payers."


