the photo with the hashtag #biglakeparkschallenge2022 here along with the name of the park.



The community with the most entries submit will receive the traveling trophy, sponsored by Majestic Creations. Big Lake won the trophy last year.







Unemployment Insurance. While the Senate quickly passed a fix to repay Minnesota's Unemployment Insurance (UI) Trust Fund deficit, the House DFL continues to use Minnesota businesses as a negotiation tactic. We need to pass a fix as soon as possible to help pull back a double digit payroll tax increase. Rep. Paul Novotny supports the Senate bill. If you know other Representatives, please contact them to support employers.

Reinsurance Extension was passed by Legislative leaders and Governor Walz before the April 1 federal deadline. This an important tool in keeping health care premium rates affordable for employers and employees and has kept rates about 20% lower than what they otherwise would be.

Taxes: With a record-setting \$9.25 billion surplus and over a billion of unspent ARPA federal dollars, MN Chamber supports permanent business tax relief and lower tax where Minnesota is the most uncompetitive.

- The Senate tax bill includes \$3.5 billion of tax relief in FY 2022/23 and \$5 billion in FY 2024/25 by reducing bottom tier income tax rate and exempting social security income.
- The House includes \$1.6 billion of tax relief in FY 2022/23 and \$1.6 billion in FY 2024/25 through variety of tax aids and credits.
- The governor proposed \$240 million in tax relief plus a \$2 billion one-time rebate and \$258 million in on-going tax relief for FY 2024/25.

Options Executive Director Brenda Geldert and Chamber Board Secretary joined State Auditor Julie Blaha, Rochester and Moorhead mayors, and Hennepin & Winona County Commissioner and staff last month as they discuss the State of Main Street and how CARES Act funding impacted their communities during the pandemic. DEED's Regional Analyst Luke Greiner reported last month that Transportation employment is still lower than pre-pandemic levels. Read about it here!


