- *Note that although this program is for the girls, families are very much involved.





Minnesota Chamber Women in Business is offering a workshop on recreational marijuana and Potential Workplace Impacts March 1st in Maple Grove. <u>Register here!</u>

Gov. Walz signed a bill this week passed by DFL state legislators that restricts utilities to be 100% carbon-free by 2040. Republicans attempted to modify or eliminate the moratorium for nuclear facility construction but were unsuccessful. MN Chamber testified that MN ranks 16th highest in the nation for commercial electrical costs and 12th highest for industrial. This compares to 20 years ago, when Minnesota ranked 34th for industrial prices and 28th ten years ago.

MN Chamber testified against SF2/HF2, the 24-week paid leave mandate, sharing how the proposal's expansiveness (24 weeks of leave or 44% of a working year) and expensiveness (\$1 billion tax increase) would impede Minnesota's competitiveness and growth. This mandate applies to ALL employers, no matter if you have just one employee and will cost employers .7% payroll tax to fund the program. Learn more here!

Alpha News reported that 20,000 Minnesotans left in 2022 for other states, primarily Florida and Texas. Despite this domestic migration loss, MN's estimated population increased by 5,721 from last year, or less than 1%. According to the Census data, this was mostly driven by 11,617 more births than deaths, as well as a net increase of international migration, with 14,194 people coming to Minnesota from foreign countries. <u>Read about it here!</u>


