Greetings, Friends!

Megan and I were able to take a few days away and attend training for Wisconsin Chamber of Commerce Executives in Green Bay. We were able to hear from excellent presenters, sponsors, and other chambers of commerce throughout the state. It was reassuring, in many ways, to hear from so many others that experienced some of the same struggles, fears, and insecurities that we did over the last 18 months.

Of course, we heard many good and bad things that are trending, some of which, I'll share with you.

The bad:

- Wisconsin is losing on average 5,000 people per year over the last 5 years.
- Labor shortage isn't going away any time soon and may get worse before it gets better.
- Supply chain issues continue to cause global product shortages.
- There is a decline in the amount of young adults entering into higher education why this is bad is because they are also not entering into apprenticeships, receiving technical training, or the workforce they are staying at home.

The good:

- The WEDC is providing a Workforce Innovation Grant Program to organizations that develop innovative plans to solve workforce challenges and a Main Street Bounceback Grant to help new or existing businesses move into and revitalize vacant commercial properties.
- Chambers of Commerce all over the state are working hard, outside of your payroll, to advocate for business policy and are at the grassroots efforts of improving the labor shortage.
- We aren't in Illinois. Why this is good, aside from we aren't Bears fans, is that Illinois has lost on average 100,000 people over the last 5 years.

This sounds like a lot of doom and gloom, and to be fair, it isn't a pretty picture, but it brings our mission into laser focus. We need to continue to work with our schools to draw attention to the jobs we have in our area that provide opportunity, growth, income, and financial independence. We need to continue to partner with our area businesses to share your stories with all policy makers. We need to continue to focus on our community by creating an environment that people want to live and work in.

Thank you all for allowing us to take a few days away to network, learn, and bring back valuable information. We're back in the office, working full time – outside of your payroll – to help your businesses and to attract people to our community.

We look forward to celebrating Manufacturing Month and highlighting some of the manufacturing that goes on in our area as well as planning our budget and programming for 2022.

Thank you for all of your hard work to keep business moving in Tomah and the surrounding areas. We know you're all doing it with challenges you never thought you'd face and we salute you for pushing through.

Take care and know that we see you and your struggles.






